

# Takže RAND říká, že USA prohrály válku na Ukrajině a měly by kapitulovat. Co dál?, Andrew Anglin

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***Poznámka autora :** RT provedla druhý, větší zápis papíru RAND, „Avoiding the Long War“. Četl jsem originál, ale projít a vytáhnout citáty vyžaduje tolik úsilí, že jednoduše komentovat tento díl je mnohem jednodušší.*

**Dříve: Think Tank RAND říká, že válka na Ukrajině již není pro židovskou „dvojí anální agendu“ přínosem**

RAND vystoupit a říct, že USA už prohrály válku na Ukrajině a měly by se prostě vzdát, je v podstatě to největší, co se od invaze stalo.

Od té doby, co USA/NATO na rovinu řekly, že v březnu 2022 nikdy nebudou žádná jednání, tak trochu jen sledujeme strojový proces, kde nikdo ve skutečnosti nedělá žádná rozhodnutí. Všechno to byl jen tempomat. Špičkový válečný think-tank, který říká „dobře, pojďme to zabalit a jdeme dál“, vytváří situaci, kdy by se konečně mohlo něco skutečně stát.

Faktem je, že „potřebujeme tyto zdroje pro válku s Číňany“ je argument, který bude ve skutečnosti rezonovat u mnoha lidí ve Washingtonu.

RT :

**RAND Corporation, vysoce vlivný elitní think tank pro národní bezpečnost financovaný přímo Pentagonem, zveřejnil přelomovou zprávu, v níž uvádí, že prodlužování zástupné války aktivně poškozuje USA a jejich spojence a varuje Washington, že by se měl vyvarovat „vleklého konfliktu“ v USA. Ukrajina.**

Zpráva má jednoznačný název „Vyhýbání se dlouhé válce: politika USA a trajektorie rusko-ukrajinského konfliktu“, což je jasným náznakem jejího obsahu.

Začíná konstatováním, že boje představují „nejvýznamnější mezistátní konflikt za desítky let a jeho vývoj bude mít velké důsledky“ pro Washington, což zahrnuje aktivně poškozované „zájmy“ USA. Zpráva velmi jasně uvádí, že zatímco Ukrajinci bojovali a jejich města byla „srovnána se zemí“ a „decimována ekonomika“, tyto „zájmy“ „nejsou synonymem“ Kyjeva.

Urychlené ukončení finanční, humanitární a zejména vojenské podpory ze strany USA by způsobilo úplný kolaps Ukrajiny a RAND uvádí několik důvodů, proč by to bylo rozumné, v neposlední řadě proto, že ukrajinské vítězství je považováno za „nepravděpodobné“ a „nepravděpodobné“. k ruskému „odhodlání“ a jeho vojenské mobilizaci, která „napravila nedostatek pracovních sil, který umožnil Ukrajině úspěch v charkovské protiofenzívě“.

Je tak legrační, jak to nejvyšší myslitelé Pentagonu říkají tak věcně, zatímco celá americká média – která také zastupují americkou vládu – říkají pravý opak. Stále doslova říkají, že Rusko prohrává (protože volají po nahození nekonečných zbraní na Ukrajinu, aby se zabránilo zhroucení anální židovské falešné země).

Americká média se o této zprávě RAND vůbec nezmiňují. Je to vlastně strašidelné, způsob, jakým lze tyto věci jednoduše vynechat. Zatímco Daily Stormer a další publikace založené na realitě hovoří o zprávě RAND, hlavní ukrajinský článek v New York Times hovoří o dalších hloupých blábolech o tom, jak se Rusko hroutí.

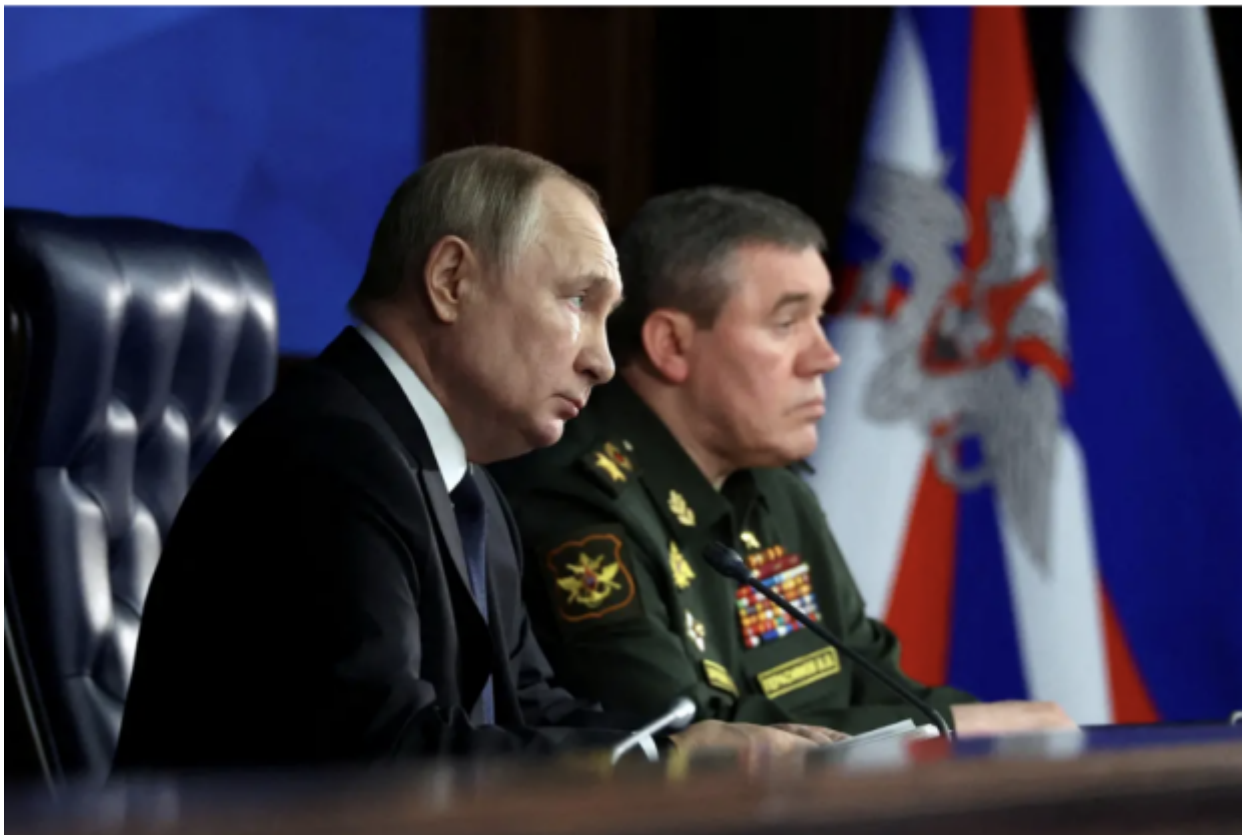


## *To Fix Its Problems in Ukraine, Russia Turns to the Architect of the War*

President Vladimir V. Putin is on his third overall commander in Ukraine. But his military's fundamental issues have not been addressed, Western officials say.

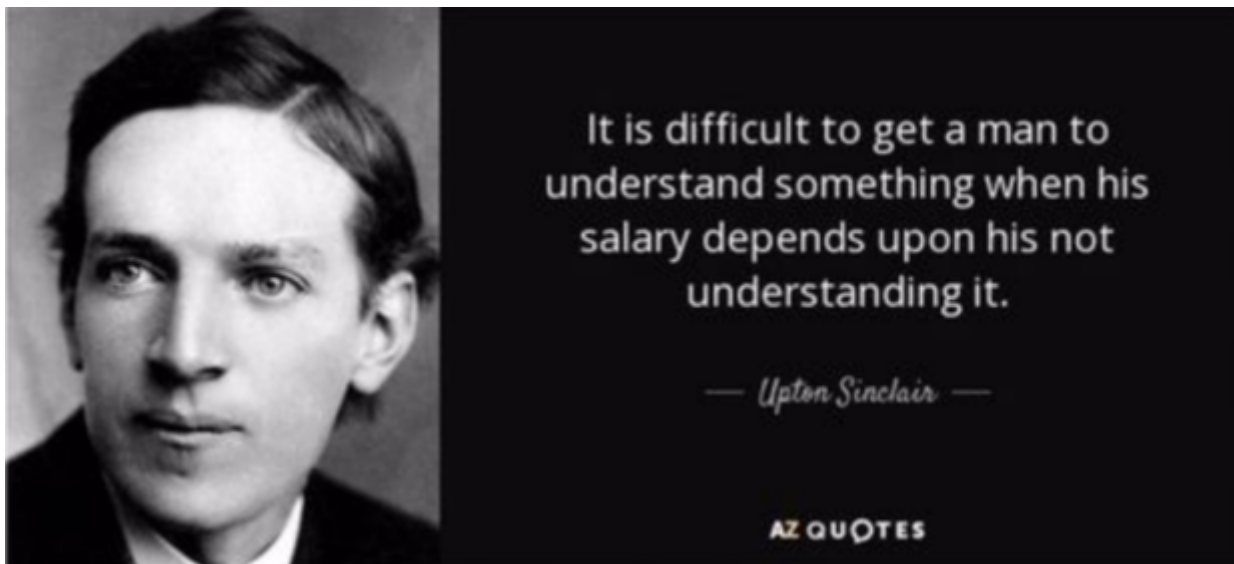

Podle mých zkušeností jsou to velmi hloupí lidé. Jako, šokující hloupost. Méně schopný sledovat tok myšlenek než automechanik. Ale jak by si nemohli být vědomi této zprávy RAND? Pokud bude kapitulace USA pro novináře překvapením, vezmou to s nadhledem, jako když zjistili, že vax není ani bezpečný, ani účinný.

Z pohledu amerických „zájmů“ RAND varuje, že ačkoli Kreml nepohrozil použitím jaderných zbraní, existuje „několik problémů, které činí ruské použití jaderných zbraní jak věrohodnou nahodilostí, kterou musí Washington zohlednit, a nesmírně důležitým faktorem v určení budoucí trajektorie konfliktu.“

**Think tank věří, že Bidenova administrativa „má dostatek důvodů k tomu, aby prevence ruského použití jaderných zbraní byla prvořadou prioritou“.** Zejména by se měla snažit vyhnout „přímé jaderné výměně“ s Moskvou, „přímému konfliktu s Ruskem“ nebo širší „válce NATO-Rusko“.

To je, zatímco Petraeus tam venku žertuje o jaderných zbraních a říká, že to opravdu není velký problém, když Rusko shodí pár jaderných zbraní.

Celá Bidenova administrativa říká, že Putin je blázen, je na drogách a chystá se zemřít, ale že je příliš rozumný na to, aby kdy použil atomovku.

Pokud jde o druhý bod, RAND se obává, že požadavek amerického generála Marka Milleyho, aby konflikt zůstal „uvnitř geografických hranic Ukrajiny“, je na pokraji nerespektování, protože „rozsah nepřímého zapojení spojenců NATO do války je svým rozsahem dechberoucí.“, včetně „zbraní a další pomoci v hodnotě desítek miliard dolarů“ a „taktické zpravodajské, sledovací a průzkumné podpory“ spolu s „miliardami dolarů měsíčně v přímé rozpočtové podpoře Kyjevu“.

Taková velkorysost by mohla podle předpovědí RAND přimět Moskvu k „potrestání členů NATO... s cílem ukončit spojeneckou podporu Ukrajině; udeřit preventivně NATO, pokud Rusko pochopí, že se blíží intervence NATO na Ukrajině; zakázat převoz zbraní na Ukrajinu; provést odvetu proti NATO za domnělou podporu vnitřních nepokojů v Rusku,“ pokud Kreml dojde k závěru, že národní bezpečnost země je „vážně ohrožena“.

S touto částí moc nesouhlasím. Rusko nechce eskalovat válku mimo Ukrajinu. Pokud by to udělali, pravděpodobně by skočili rovnou k atomovkám.

Na druhou stranu USA se k tomu stavěly nenuceně. Ukrajina zaútočila na Polsko, Bělorusko, Moldavsko a samotné Rusko. USA také zaútočily na Německo bombardováním těchto trubek a aktivně se snaží vyvolat nějakou věc v Kosovu.

Pokud by došlo k oficiální eskalaci ukrajinského konfliktu, USA by provedly ruský útok pod falešnou vlajkou na Polsko (možná něco jiného jako Finsko, ale nejspíš Polsko).

Tyto výsledky nejsou „v žádném případě nevyhnutelné“, ale stále představují „zvýšené“ riziko, zejména ve světle incidentů, jako je ukrajinská raketa protivzdušné obrany zasáhla polské území v listopadu 2022 – situaci zhoršil ukrajinský prezident Vladimír Zelenskij, který nepravdivě tvrdil, že byla úmyslný ruský úder. **I když se tato událost „nevymkla kontrole, ukázala, že boje se mohou neúmyslně přenést na území sousedních spojenců USA“.**

Vidíte, oni vědí. Nemohou prostě používat jazyk typu „falešná vlajka“, ale každý, kdo je dostatečně informovaný na to, aby četl články RAND, rozumí, o čem mluví.

Další podobný incident by mohl znamenat, že „americká armáda by se okamžitě zapojila do horké války se zemí, která má největší jaderný arzenál na světě“. Tomuto, stejně jako konvenčnímu konfliktu mezi NATO a Ruskem, by se Washington měl za každou cenu vyhnout, tvrdí RAND.

**Jasným důsledkem je, že USA by takový konflikt mohly prohrát, přičemž jedním z klíčových důvodů je, jak zdůrazňuje RAND, že „intenzita vojenské pomoci“ poskytované Ukrajině jejími západními podporovateli se již blíží „neudržitelné“ úrovni, přičemž USA a evropské zásoby zbraní „docházejí“. To následně znamená, že delší válka se rovná více ukrajinskému území znovu sjednocenému s Ruskem.**

**Pokud jde o územní ztráty, RAND není pohnut argumenty, že by se Ukrajina měla pokusit získat zpět vše, co ztratila od roku 2014, protože „větší územní kontrola přímo nesouvisí s větší ekonomickou prosperitou“ nebo „větší bezpečností“.**

Haha.

To je to, co říkám od roku 2014: obsazení Krymu (nebo nyní Donbasu) by nijak nezlepšilo životy průměrného hoholu a neposílilo by to status Ukrajiny jako země. Celá tato úvaha je falešná, zcela založená na touze USA ublížit Rusku. „Hranice jsou posvátné“ je ideologická pozice, o kterou USA nikdy nestály.

Pozemek, který od září zabral Kyjev, znamená, že „Rusko uvalilo na zemi jako celek mnohem větší ekonomické náklady“.

**RAND také považuje argumenty, že by měla být zajištěna „větší ukrajinská teritoriální kontrola“, „pro posílení mezinárodních norem a pro podporu budoucího hospodářského růstu Ukrajiny“, za „spornou“, protože i v „nepravděpodobné“ události Kyjev tlačí „za hranice“. linii kontroly před únorem 2022 a podaří se mu znovu dobýt oblasti, které Rusko okupovalo od roku 2014,“ „vypuknou“ rizika eskalace z Moskvy, včetně „použití jaderných zbraní nebo útoku na NATO“.**

To vše je jen základní zdravý rozum.

Ale od začátku tohoto debaklu šokujícím způsobem chybí na diskuzi ve Washingtonu.

**„Kreml by pravděpodobně považoval potenciální ztrátu Krymu za mnohem závažnější hrozbu pro národní bezpečnost i stabilitu režimu,“ varuje zpráva.**

Všechny tyto faktory činí „vyhnutí se dlouhé válce... nejvyšší prioritou po minimalizaci rizik eskalace“, takže RAND doporučuje USA „podniknout kroky, které učiní ukončení konfliktu ve střednědobém horizontu pravděpodobnější“, včetně „vydání ujištění o neutralitě země .“, o co Moskva žádala před vypuknutím konfliktu, k hluchým uším, stejně jako „zmírnění sankcí pro Rusko“.

Ano, volají po splnění Putinových požadavků, tj. požadují kapitulaci.

Samozřejmě je důležité porozumět kontextu: tito lidé se mnohem více zajímají o Čínu než o Rusko, protože Čína je skutečnou supervelmocí ohrožující západní/židovskou dominanci.

Rusko, které převzalo celé NATO, se dokázalo udržet. Není šance, že by se Rusko v dohledné době zhroutilo. Někteří lidé ve Washingtonu si zřejmě mysleli, že to bude snadné vítězství, a nebylo (většinou kvůli schopnosti Ruska procházet sankcemi a skutečně zvýšit velikost své ekonomiky, spíše než kvůli jejich výkonu na bojišti), takže logické teď by bylo snížit jejich ztráty a soustředit se na Čínu.

### **Lidé budou vypadat hloupě**

Proces nyní začal. Výzva byla učiněna, a jak říkám minimálně od dubna, USA jednoduše spalují zdroje bez potenciálu jakéhokoli přínosu, zatímco Rusko vydělává dostatek peněz z ekonomického blahobytu amerických sankcí, aby pokračovalo v tom, co dělají. dělá léta.

Polovičatý závazek ohledně tanků ukazuje, že to již začalo ovlivňovat politiku.

Lidé, kteří propagovali tuto válku nebo tvrdili, že Ukrajina vyhraje, nebo se posmívali Rusku, že nesvrhlo celé NATO do tří dnů, budou velmi trapní. Možná nebudou, protože jsou to doslova stejní lidé, kteří propagovali vax, a zjevně se opravdu nemohou cítit trapně.

Pokud jde o mě, mohl bych jít do toho a trochu se posmívat. Během posledních několika měsíců na mě údajní pravíkoví lidé přišli s tím, že Rusko prohrává.

Tato obrovská spamová kampaň na Twitteru bude vypadat velmi smutně, až dojde k realizaci. Pokud jde o to: Myslím, že bude velmi těžké znovu vytvořit tento druh spamu ministerstva zahraničí na sociálních sítích. Tito lidé to zkusí, až začnou válku s Čínou, ale lidé si to podruhé nekoupí.

To by mělo být velkým posílením morálky těch, kdo stojí proti ZOG – ještě větší než vítězství Talibanu.

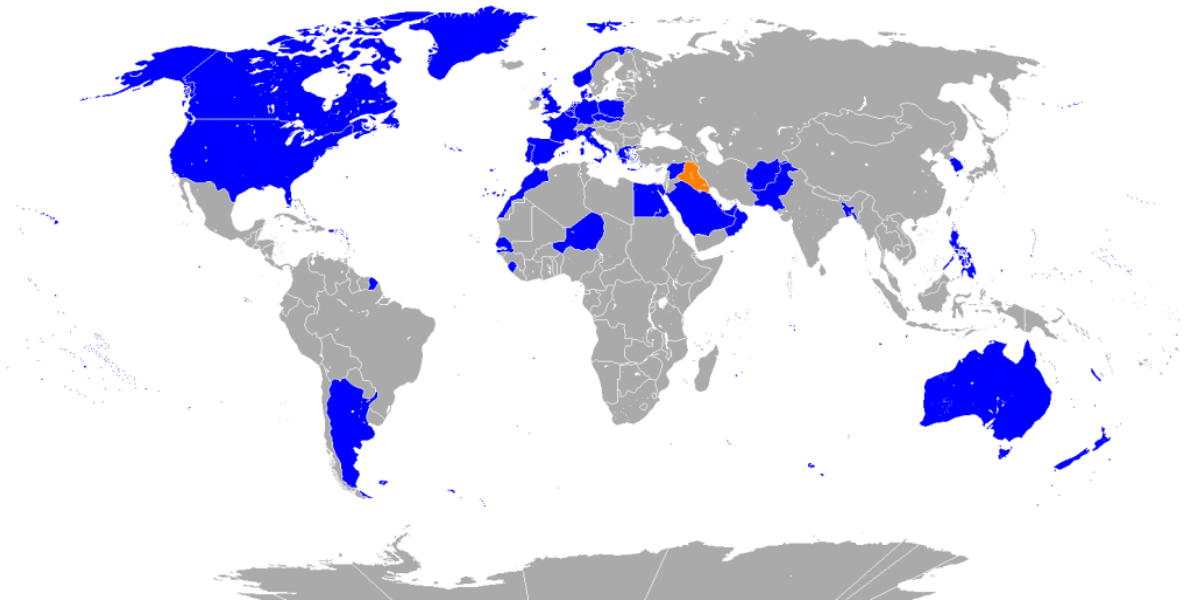

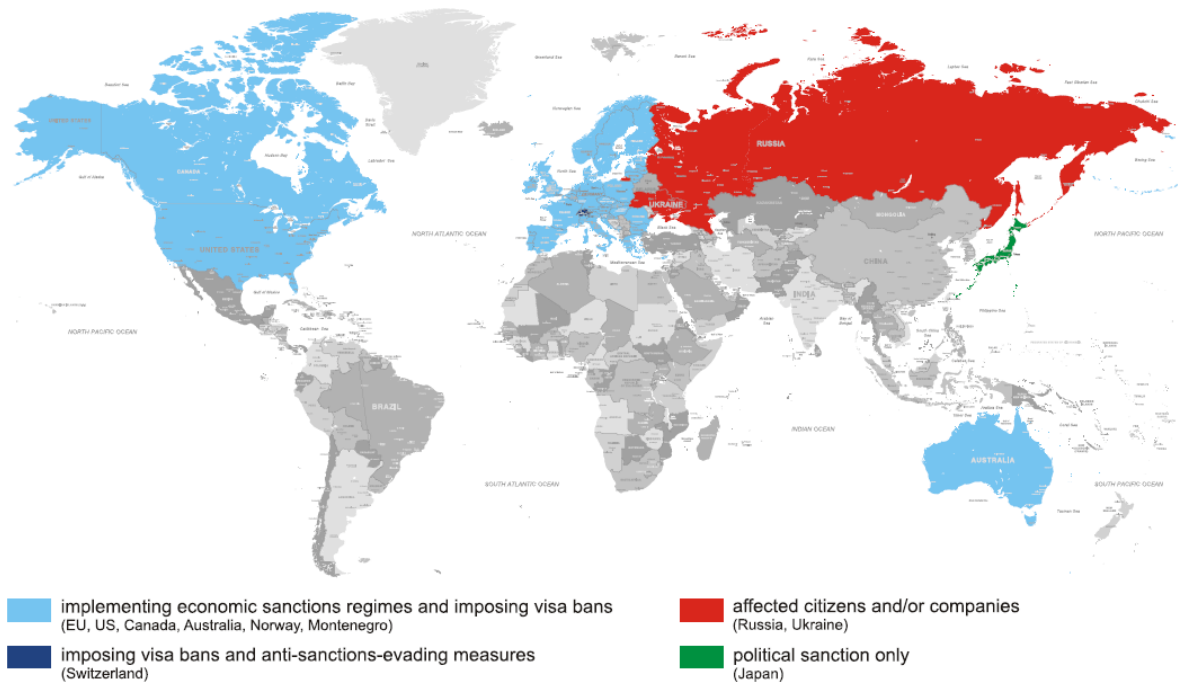

Recently, the Ukrainian government approved new rules for military registration of conscripts, conscripts and reservists. One of the clauses of the resolution obliges foreign embassies to inform Ukrainian citizens abroad about the start of a new conscription and to facilitate their return home if mobilization is taking place in the Motherland. We tell you whether men who have gone abroad can be deported back to Ukraine.

#### **How will military registration be conducted abroad?**

In accordance with the requirements of the Procedure for organizing and maintaining military records of conscripts, conscripts and reservists abroad, they must, in particular:

- to be on military registration in case of traveling outside of Ukraine for more than three months – at the place of consular registration in foreign diplomatic institutions of Ukraine;
- personally, within seven days from the day of arrival in the country, come with the passport of a citizen of Ukraine and military registration documents to the embassy or consulate of Ukraine for military registration.

It seems the thing to do is not to register on arrival in a third country, if at all possible.

At the same time, in the event of the start of the regular conscription of Ukrainian citizens for military service or the announcement of mobilization, the embassy will inform the persons about the conduct of the mentioned measures. According to the law, the diplomatic institution must facilitate (**but not forcefully deport**) the return of such persons to their home, i.e. to Ukraine.

Note! It is currently unknown how exactly the process described in the previous paragraph will take place.

So the unseemly wrangles on Ukraine streets aren't to be repeated in the UK.

**Will embassies issue summonses?**

According to the current legislation, representatives of embassies and consulates cannot issue summonses and deliver them to citizens who are abroad.

**Can conscripts, military conscripts and reservists be deported to Ukraine?**

According to Kateryna Anishchenko, a lawyer at the “Riyako&Partners” law firm, quoted by RBC-Ukraine, now the classic form of international cooperation between states is extradition – handing over a detainee – in the fight against crime.

But citizens of Ukraine who went abroad before the war or during the war are not criminals.

“Regarding the possible deportation of Ukrainian citizens by foreign states based on this point, I believe that a specific type of administrative penalty, which consists in offering a foreigner or a stateless person to voluntarily leave the country of residence, can be applied only to persons who maliciously violate the order of the country of their place of residence,” – she said.

I guess it depends where you are. In the Baltic States people are certainly getting summonses. It may be there that the authorities have greater “persuasive powers”.

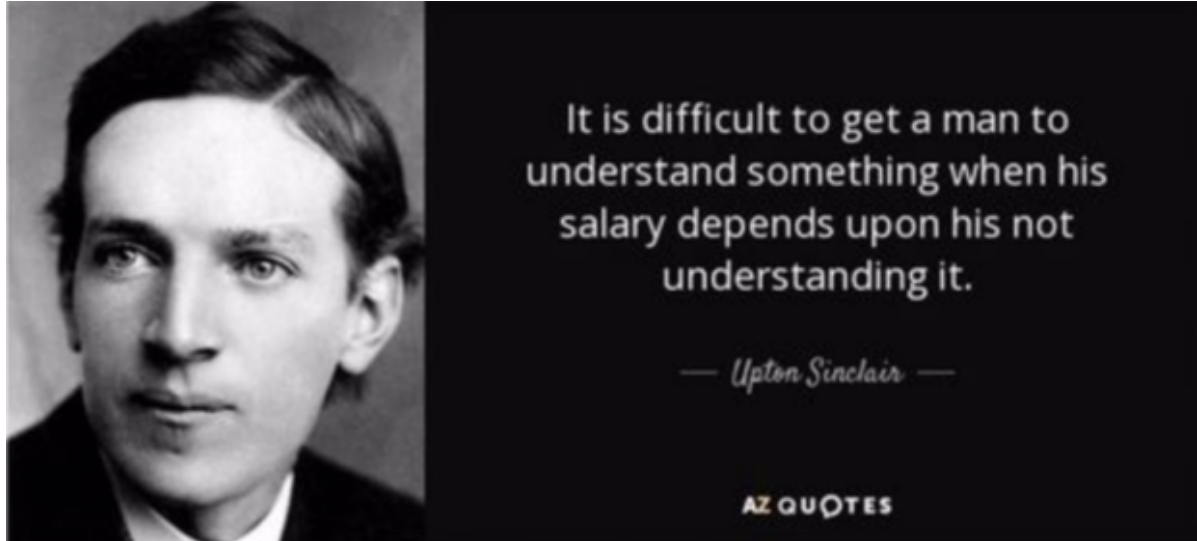
