

Ukrajinizace Tchaj-wanu

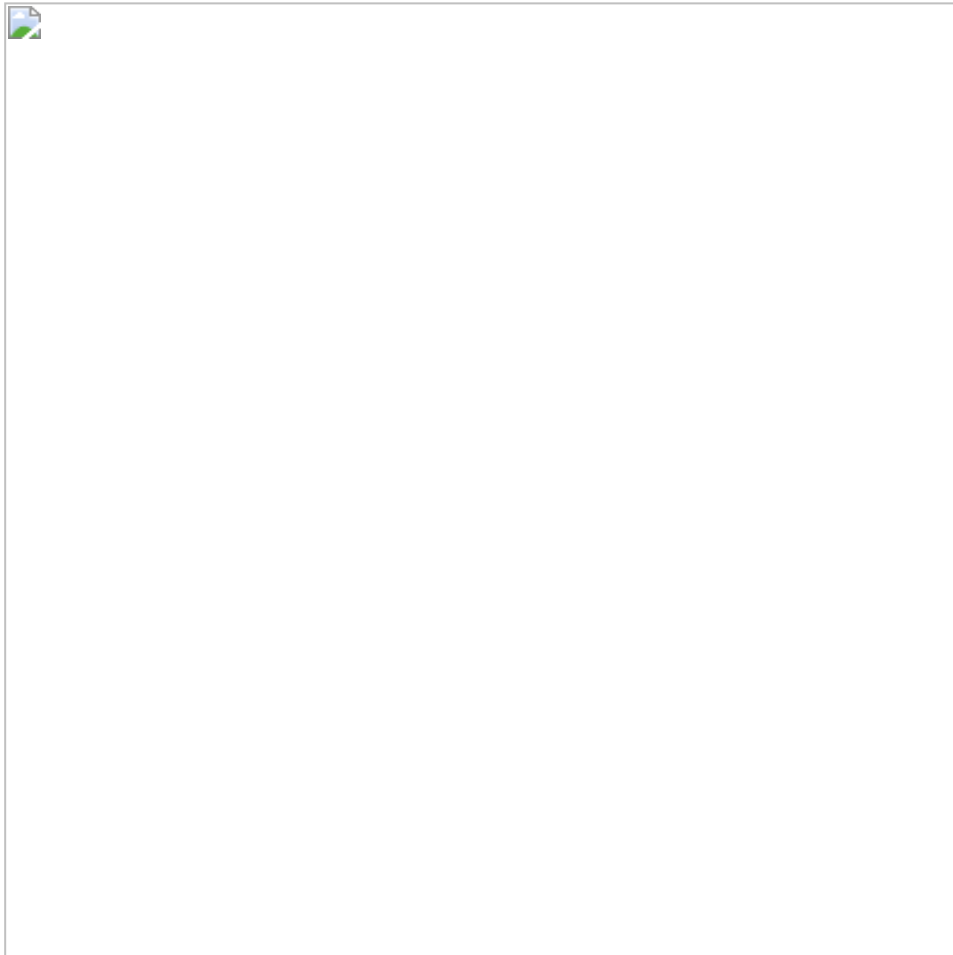
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Abychom jasně vysvětlili řadu podstatných faktů (včetně faktů, o kterých se příliš nemluví) o vztazích mezi provincií Tchaj-wan, Čínou a USA, potřebujeme znát následující základní fakta:

Neznalost tchajwanské mládeže o jejich vlastní ústavě

Nedávno se v provincii Tchaj-wan uskutečnilo několik pouličních rozhovorů s dotazem mladých Tchajwanců: „Znáte vztah mezi Čínskou republikou a Tchaj-wanem?“, odpověď tazatele šokovala, protože většina mladých lidí na Tchaj-wanu ani nevěděla, oficiální

název politické entity je Čínská republika (ROC) a ústava ROC pozoruje, že pevnina Číny a Tchaj-wan jsou součástí suverénního území ROC. Například:

- Pouliční rozhovor v červnu 2023 se zeptal: "Jaký je vztah mezi Tchaj-wanem a ROC?" Odpověď: „...Nepřítel...“; Tazatel se pak zeptal: „Slyšeli jste o ROC? Víš, kde je ROC?“ Odpověď: „Na druhé straně Tchajwanského průlivu? ... Nevím, nevím...“ Během rozhovoru téměř všichni dotazovaní neznali ROC, někteří později odpověděli: „Tchaj-wan“ (s prvkem hádání po pozorování tónu tazatele).
- Pouliční rozhovor v květnu 2023 se zeptal: „Jaký je vztah mezi Tchaj-wanem a ROC?“ Odpověď: „...vypadá to, že vztah není příliš dobrý...“; Tazatel se pak zeptal: „Podle ústavy ROC zahrnuje suverenita Tchaj-wanu pevninskou Čínu, víte to?“ Odpověď: „Ne“.

Výše uvedené rozhovory ukázaly úspěšnost pokračující taktiky vymývání mozků používané současnou vládnoucí stranou (DPP) v provincii Tchaj-wan úpravou historických faktů ve školních učebnicích v posledních 2 desetiletích. Chcete-li se o problémech dozvědět, stačí hledat pod „DDP upravit učebnici historie Taiwanu“. Pokud člověk použije zjednodušenou čínštinu nebo tradiční čínštinu k hledání tématu, dostane ještě více příkladů a zpráv na téma mladých Tchajwanců, kteří jsou silně vymývání mozky, aby věřili, že nejsou součástí čínské civilizace navzdory jejich společné historii, kultuře, tradici, hodnoty, stravovací návyky, etnická příslušnost, náboženství a jazyky (mluvené i psané). To odráží děsivý účinek toho, co by falešné zprávy a propaganda mohly způsobit rozdělení společnosti a vytvoření konfliktu po celém světě.

Jednočínské znění v ústavě ROC

Je důležité poznamenat, že obsah ústavy ROC je dnes stále stejný jako předtím, než nacionalistická vláda prohrála vnitřní válku s komunistickou stranou a v roce 1949 utekla do provincie Tchaj-wan. Je také důležité poznamenat, že všichni nastupující tchajwanští

prezidenti a poslanci musí před nástupem do úřadu složit přísahu podle ústavy ROC. Co tedy Ústava ROC říká o vztahu mezi pevninskou Čínou a ostrovem Tchaj-wan? Úplné znění ústavy ROC je na oficiálních webových stránkách současné vlády Tchaj-wanu (provincie) . Následující body ukazují, že ústava ROC zahrnuje celou pevninskou Čínu jako její suverénní území:

- Bod 4 Ústavy: Území ROC na základě jeho vnitřních hranic nelze změnit bez usnesení Národního shromáždění.
- Bod 6 se týká designu vlažky ROC používané od roku 1928 (která je dodnes v celé provincii Tchaj-wan používána kýmkoli, kdo je u moci);
- Bod 26: Uveďte počet zástupců podle počtu obyvatel v oblasti/regionu pro Národní shromáždění (se zvláštní zmínkou o regionálních představitelích Mongolska a Tibetu).
- Bod 64: O složení zástupců pro zákonodárství: v tomto bodě je také zmíněn zástupce menšinového obyvatelstva se zvláštní zmínkou o Mongolsku a Tibetu.
- Bod 91: O složení zástupců ve vládním dozorčím orgánu: opět je zmíněno Mongolsko a Tibet.

Pokud hledáme mapu ROC , všimneme si, že území ROC na mapě zahrnuje pevninu ovládanou Čínskou lidovou republikou (**ČLR**). To znamená, že území vymezené v ústavě ČLR i ROC zahrnuje provincii Tchaj-wan a pevninskou Čínu. Oba dokumenty jsou právním základem jedné Číny. Tak:

- Jakákoli formulace v západních médiích, která naznačuje, že provincie Tchaj-wan není součástí Číny, nemá žádný právní základ v rámci ústavy ROC i ČLR.
- Pokračující varování západních médií a politiků, že „Čína se chystá napadnout Tchaj-wan“ je absurdní, protože varují, že Čína se chystá napadnout sama sebe.

- Amerika pojmenovala válku mezi Jihem a Severem (12. dubna 1861 až 26. května 1865) jako americkou občanskou válku odhalující dvojí metr, pokud jde o použití termínu „invaze“ k popisu možného budoucího procesu znovusjednocení Číny prostřednictvím vojenské akce.

Proto je spor mezi ČLR a ROC dosud nevyřešenou historickou událostí. Je to čistě domácí záležitost mezi oběma vládami. Bývalý singapurský ministr zahraničí George Yao v nedávném rozhovoru správně poukázal na to, že „Čína vidí problém Tchaj-wanu jako záležitost historické spravedlnosti“; varuje západní mocnosti před nebezpečím zasahování do procesu znovusjednocení.

Území stále pod kontrolou ROC zahrnuje ostrovy vzdálené pouhé 2 km od pevniny ovládané ČLR

Mnoho lidí si nevšimlo, že území pod kontrolou dnešního ROC zahrnuje nejen samotný ostrov Tchaj-wan, ale i řadu ostrovů přímo u pevniny ČLR. Podívejte se na následující mapu obrazovky ROC (fialové území v pravém dolním rohu níže je stále pod kontrolou ROC):



Z výše uvedené mapy (fialového) území kontrolovaného ROC je třeba poznamenat, že hned vedle pevniny Číny se nacházejí ostrovy:

- Kinmen Islands (nebo Jinmen Islands v pinyin): Nejbližší část skupiny Kinmen Islands je jen 1,8 km od PRC (pevninská Čína); je to 210 km od ostrova Tchaj-wan. Bývalý hlavní ekonom čínské Světové banky Justin YiFu Lin byl armádním úředníkem ROC umístěným na ostrovech Kinmen. Je to muž „který v roce 1979 přeplaval 2130 metrů do pevninské Číny“, aby označil ČLR za domov;

- Ostrovy Matsu (nebo Mazu v Pinyin) Nejbližší část této skupiny ostrovů je vzdálena 18,5 km od pevniny Číny a 203 km od ostrova Taiwan.
- Co se týče samotného ostrova Tchaj-wan , nejbližší část k pevnině je vzdálena 126 km.

Výše uvedené informace o vzdálenosti mezi územím kontrolovaným ROC a pevninou ovládanou ČLR nám hodně napovídají o záměru vlády ČLR usilovat o mírové znovusjednocení:

- Pokud by Čína (ČLR) chtěla násilím zabrat ty ostrovy přímo u pevniny, už by to dávno udělala. Není důvod pochybovat o vojenské schopnosti ČLR tak učinit vzhledem k jejich schopnosti přinutit vojenskou koalici pod vedením USA zpět více než 500 km od hranic mezi Čínou a KLR k 38. rovnoběžce a zastavit další agresi vojenské koalice pod vedením USA v korejské válce v letech 1950-1953;
- Dokonce i samotný ostrov Tchaj-wan (provincie) je tak blízko pevnině, že moderní rakety krátkého doletu a dělostřelectvo jsou dost dobré na to, aby ochromily ekonomiku ostrova a vynutily si kapitulaci; Na rozdíl od toho, jak lidé vnímají vojenskou převahu USA, může být současná vojenská technologická schopnost CHKO vyspělejší než USA .
- Proto pokračující články a zprávy v západních médiích s nadpisy, které naznačují očekávanou agresi Číny a možnou invazi na Tchaj-wan, aby ospravedlnily militarismus USA/Japonska/NATO/Austrálie/Kanady na čínském práhu, nejsou nic jiného než pomlouvačná kampaň proti Číně.

Historie vztahu ostrova Tchaj-wan s čínskými dynastiemi se datuje do roku 230 našeho letopočtu

Historie vztahu ostrova Tchaj-wan s čínskými dynastiemi lze vysledovat až do roku 230 našeho letopočtu. Tyto stránky (v angličtině) a tyto stránky (v čínštině) poskytují podrobnou časovou osu vztahů Tchaj-wanu s čínskými dynastiemi začínajícími již v roce 230 n. l.: Během éry 3 království byl písemný záznam (沈莹)

Shen Ying pod názvem 《临海水土志》 (přímá transakce slovo po slovu: „rekord okolních mořských vod a zemí“) již zmínil ostrov Tchajwan. A to je téměř před 1800 lety.

Problémem mnoha lidí, kteří toho o čínské historii příliš nezkoumali, je to, že mohou být náchylní k západní mediální propagandě, která Čínu vykresluje jako historicky zaostalou ve srovnání se Západem, a proto pokračující pomlouvačná kampaň, že Čína krade západní technologie. Takže pro některé lidi může být těžké uvěřit, že v roce 230 n. l. již Číňané disponují přepravní technologií k prozkoumávání ostrovů vzdálených stovky km v rozbouřeném moři. Je tedy důležité, abychom si všimli následujících faktů o tom, že Číňané jsou v přepravní technologii po tisíce let mnohem pokrokovější než Západ:

- Je třeba poznamenat, že kompas používaný Kolumbem k „objevení“ Ameriky v roce 1492 ni byl kompas vynalezený Číňany (mezi lety 202 př. n. l. – 220 n. l. během dynastie Han);
- Před 2500 lety měla Čína nejen skvělého vojenského стратега Sun Zi (Umění války) pro pozemní bitvy, ale také válečného стратега námořnictva (伍子胥) Wu Zi Xu pro vodní bitvy 《水战兵法》 (přímý překlad slovo za slovem „Vojenská válečná strategie“).

Měli bychom si také uvědomit, že předtím, než Kolumbus v roce 1492 „objevil“ Ameriku (jako kdyby domorodé národy na kontinentu v té době nebyly považovány za „lidské bytosti“, a tak musí být země „objevena“ „vyšší bytostí“. „ z Evropy), generál námořnictva dynastie Ming Zheng He již vedl 7 zaoceánských expedic putujících po světě (1405 až 1433) se „stovkami obrovských lodí a desítkami tisíc námořníků a dalších cestujících. Více než 60 z 317 lodí na první plavbě byly obrovské lodě pokladů, plachetnice dlouhé přes 400 stop, široké 160 stop, s několika palubami, 9 stěžněmi, 12 plachtami a luxusními kajutami s balkony.

Je důležité poznamenat, že navzdory takovému rozsahu světových plaveb Čína neudělala to, co cesty Kolumba a kapitána Cooka udělaly s domorodým obyvatelstvem v tom, co se stalo Amerikou,

Kanadou, Austrálií a Novým Zélandem. Císařské plavby dynastie Ming vedené generálem Zheng He (čínským muslimem) měly mírovou povahu.

Existuje také dobře prozkoumaná kniha 1421: Rok, kdy Čína objevila svět (včetně Ameriky) Gavinem Menziesem (bývalým velitelem ponorek britského královského námořnictva), který strávil 15 let sledováním úžasných plaveb flotily dynastie Ming, navštívil více než 900 muzeí po celém světě, zapojil se do rozhovorů a korespondence s profesory univerzit specializovaných na Asii. Studujte a čtěte stovky titulů v knihovnách evropských zemí, které zmiňovaly čínské cesty. Navzdory skutečnosti, že Gavinovo působivé vyprávění spojuje starověké mapy, přesné navigační znalosti, astronomii a dochované zprávy čínských průzkumníků a pozdějších evropských mořeplavců a že Gavinův výzkum také přináší na světlo artefakty a napsané kameny, které po sobě zanechala císařova flotila, důkazy o potopených harampádích dynastie Ming podél její trasy, a zdobené votivní dary zanechané čínskými námořníky, ať přistáli kdekoli, Gavinova kniha stále zdiskreditovaná západní propagandistickou mašinérií jako „fikce“ a „kontroverze“. Jako čtenář Kevinovy knihy do posledního slova jsem přesvědčen o nezpochybnitelných důkazech předložených v souvislosti s imperiálními cestami dynastie Ming, nicméně důležité jsou i názory ostatních čtenářů. Je třeba poznamenat, že v červenci 1894 Japonsko zahájilo útočnou válku proti Číně. V dubnu 1895 byla poražená vláda dynastie Čching nucena postoupit Tchaj-wan atd. Japonsku na základě nerovné smlouvy (Smlouva Shimonoseki v japonštině, v čínštině také známá jako smlouva Maguan).

Mezinárodní smlouvy USA, Spojeného království, Číny a Japonska uznaly Tchaj-wan jako území Číny.

Káhirská deklaráce z roku 1943 (obrázek původního dokumentu):

Podepsána prezidentem Rooseveltem (USA), generalissimem Čankajškem (prezident ROC) a premiérem Churchillem (UK) jako vojenští spojenci proti japonské vojenské agresí. Cílem Káhirske deklaráce je „zajistit bezpodmínečnou kapitulaci Japonska“ a že „všechna území, která Japonsko ukradlo Číňanům, jako je Mandžusko, Formosa (známá jako „Tchaj-wan“ v čínštině), a ... budou obnovena. Čínská republika“ (v té době čínská vláda). (Poznámka: Zdá se, že webová stránka amerického vládního historického dokumentu (<https://history.state.gov/historicaldocuments>) odstranila dokument Káhirske deklaráce)

Postupimská deklaráce z roku 1945 (obrázek původního dokumentu) V bodě 8 bylo uvedeno: „Podmínky Káhirske deklaráce budou splněny a **japonská suverenita bude omezena na ostrovy Honšú, Hokkaidó, Kjúšú, Šikoku** a takové menší ostrovy jako my. určit.“ A znovu, tato mezinárodní smlouva byla uzavřena vládami USA, Číny a Spojeného království a odsouhlasena japonskou vládou poté, co USA shodily 2 atomové bomby na Japonsko.

Poznámka : Webová stránka amerického vládního historického dokumentu zobrazuje celý obsah tohoto 13bodového dokumentu včetně **bodu 8** .

Takže výše uvedené dva mezinárodní dokumenty vložené USA, Čínou, Velkou Británií a Japonskem uznaly Tchaj-wan jako součást Číny a území Japonska je omezeno na ostrovy Honšú, Hokkaidó, Kjúšú a Šikoku a takové menší ostrovy, které určíme. .“

Rezoluce OSN nahradila ROC za ČLR jako jedinou legitimní vládu Číny.

Rezoluce OSN 2758 : přijata 25. října 1971: „Uznala Čínskou lidovou republiku (ČLR) jako „jediného legitimního zástupce Číny v OSN“ a odstranila „představitel Čankajška“ (s odkazem na ROC) z Organizace spojených národů.“

Od té doby, k červnu 2023, ze 193 členských zemí OSN uznává vládu ROC pouze 12 menších zemí a 181 uznává vládu ČLR. (Včetně USA a všech ostatních západních vlád. To je podmínka pro navázání diplomatických vztahů s ČLR.)

V důsledku toho potřebuje ROC (na Tchaj-wanu) souhlas ČLR, aby získala přístup k jakýmkoli mezinárodním organizacím nebo institucím, jako jsou olympijské hry, WHO atd. Suverenita ČLR nad Tchaj-wanem je oficiálně uznávána dokumentem OSN a 181 členskými státy OSN.

Krev je hustší než voda: Politika mírového znovusjednocení od Maa po Xi

Pokud člověk na internetu hledá „台灣血比水浓“ (Tchajwanská krev je hustší než voda), všimne si, že za desítky let existují miliony článků a novinových titulků popisujících pocity čínského lidu v ČLR vůči Číňaně v ROC (provincie Tchaj-wan). Považují lidi na Tchaj-wanu za své bratry a sestry a doufají v mírové znovusjednocení. Od založení ČLR čínské vedení (od Maa po Si Ťin-pchinga) tvrdě pracuje na mírovém znovusjednocení s provincií Tchaj-wan. Stačí jmenovat několik příkladů takto:

Příklad 1:

Během čínské revoluce zabila tehdejší vláda nacionalistické strany vedená prezidentem ROC Čankajškem 6 příbuzných předsedy Maa, včetně Maovy milované manželky (Yang Kaihui). V roce 1957 napsal předseda Mao dojemnou báseň na památku své zesulé manželky s popisem svého zármutku, když slyšel zprávu o její vraždě nacionalistickou vládou: „propukla v slzy jako dešťová voda“ (泪飞顿作倾盆雨). Navzdory takovému osobnímu zármutku ze ztráty milované osoby dal předseda Mao na první místo zájem lidí a čínského národa: Například:

Poté, co Čína a KLDR vyhrály korejskou válku proti 16členné vojenské koalici pod vedením USA, existovala představa, že západní státy se snaží odtrhnout Tchaj-wan od mateřské země a vytvořit dvě Číny, jako jsou dvě Koreje (Severní a Jižní Korea). a dvě Německa

(východní a západní Německo). Aby tomu zabránil, napsal Mao v roce 1956 osobní dopis Čankajškovi , ve kterém mu řekl, jak je pro čínský národ důležitá geografická poloha Tchaj-wanu při přístupu k Tichému oceánu, a vyzval ho, aby chránil zájem čínské civilizace na zachování princip politiky jedné Číny. To je provincie Tchaj-wan a pevnina jako integrované součásti jedné Číny. Poté nastolil myšlenku vyjednávání směrem k mírovému znovusjednocení podle následujících zásad:

- Cizí mocnosti by měly být mimo Tchaj-wan.
- Tchaj-wan musí uznat Ústřední lidovou vládu jako jedinou legitimní vládu ČLR.
- Jak nacionalistická strana, tak komunistická strana musí podporovat zásadu politiky jedné Číny.
- Po sjednocení Tchaj-wanu s pevninou bude Čankajšek požívat zvláštního privilegovaného postavení.
- Po sjednocení si Čankajšek kromě zahraničních věcí a obrany zachová pravomoc spravovat Tchaj-wan ve všech ostatních aspektech, jako je pravomoc jmenovat úředníky a jejich odvolávání na Tchaj-wanu, státní pokladnu na Tchaj-wanu a Chiang si může ponechat jeho ozbrojené síly a ústřední vláda bude financovat rozvoj Tchaj-wanu.
- Po sjednocení obě strany zastaví skryté operace a propagandu proti sobě a neudělají nic, co by poškodilo vztah obou politických stran.

V dopise Mao také přiložil fotografii hrobu Chiangova předka v Číně a řekl mu, že jsou dobře udržované. (Fotka níže):



Bohužel pro Chianga to bylo těžké rozhodnutí.

Chiang zemřel v roce 1975; dodnes není jeho rakev stále pohřbena.

Podle deníku jeho syna Chiang Jing-guo: Chiang si přál být pohřben na pevnině : v Nanjingu, Sunjatsenově mauzoleu v hoře Zijin, pavilonu Zhengqi. Proto čekají na den, kdy bude politické klima takové, že Chiang může být pohřben.

Příklad 2:

V roce 1981 ČLR formulovala 9bodovou politiku směřující k mírovému znovusjednocení v rámci politiky jedné Číny (níže je překlad z čínského textu):

- Komunistická strana a nacionalistická strana mohou vyjednávat rovnocenně.

- Obě strany dosáhly dohody o poštovních, komerčních, leteckých, rodinných návštěvách, cestovním ruchu a akademických, kulturních a sportovních výměnách.
- Po znovusjednocení si Tchaj-wan může ponechat armádu a užívat si zvláštní autonomii jako zvláštní administrativní oblast.
- Tchajwanská společnost, ekonomický systém, způsob života a ekonomické a kulturní vztahy s ostatními cizími zeměmi zůstávají nezměněny; soukromý majetek, domy, pozemky, obchodní vlastnictví, zákonná dědická práva a zahraniční investice jsou nedotknutelné.
- Političtí vůdci na Tchaj-wanu mohou sloužit jako vůdci národních politických institucí a podílet se na národním řízení.
- Když jsou místní finance Tchaj-wanu v potížích, může je ústřední vláda podle svého uvážení dotovat.
- Tchajwancům, kteří se chtějí vrátit na pevninu žít, je zaručeno, že se řádně zařídí, budou svobodně přicházet a odcházet a nebudou diskriminováni.
- Přivítejte investice tchajwanských podniků na pevnině, jejich zákonná práva a zisky jsou zaručeny.
- Lidé a organizace ze všech společenských vrstev na Tchaj-wanu jsou vítáni, aby poskytovali jednotné návrhy a společně diskutovali o státních záležitostech.

Zašel někdy nějaký jiný národ ve světové historii tak daleko, trpělivosti, inkluzivitě a velkorysosti při usilování o mírové znovusjednocení s nabídkou jako je tato? Vláda ČLR vždy věřila, že časem bude schopna vyvinout Čínu v lepší a lepší společnost a nakonec se sjednotí s každým srdcem a myslí na Tchaj-wanu. Západní média samozřejmě nikdy neřeknou světu výše uvedených štědrých 9 bodů, které byly Tchaj-wanu nabídnuty za mírové znovusjednocení. Budou jen říkat světu, že Čína šikanuje Tchaj-wan. Příklad 3:

Po letech vyjednávání dosáhly v roce 1992 Komunistická strana ČLR a Nacionalistická strana ROC v Singapuru dohodu o prohloubení výměny lidí mezi oběma stranami. Obě strany souhlasí

se zásadami One China a jakékoli další záležitosti lze projednat flexibilně. Termín používaný pro takovou historickou dohodu je „Konsensus z roku 1992“.

Příklad 4:

Aby si ČLR získala srdce a mysl bratří a sester v provincii Tchaj-wan, byla k tchajwanským farmářům a podnikům velmi štědrá a umožnila Tchaj-wanu těšit se z obrovského obchodního přebytku ve výši až 104,68 miliardy dolarů ročně. Asi 44 % tchajwanského exportu směřuje do pevninské Číny. Bez ekonomické podpory ČLR by taiwanská ekonomika pravděpodobně upadla do záporného HDP jako většina částí západního světa.

Opět platí, že západní masmédiá nemají zájem podávat výše uvedené obchodní statistiky.

Příklad 5:

ROC kontrolované ostrovy Kinmen (Jinmen) s rostoucí populací a problémem nedostatku vody. Mezi lety 2006 a 2022 se počet obyvatel ostrovů Jinmen zvýšil ze 76 000 na 141 500. Aby pomohla bratrům a sestrám v Jinmen vyřešit jejich problém s vodou, vláda ČLR během 22 let značně investovala do infrastruktury pro položení podzemního a podmořského potrubí, které bude dodávat vodu z pevniny na ostrovy. A prodávat vodu na ostrovy za dotovanou cenu 9,89 tchajwanských dolarů za jednotku vody, což je levnější než poplatky za jednotku vody dodávané místními úřady na ostrovech. Opět platí, že západní média nebudou zprávy jako tato. Budou jen dál šířit zprávu do světa: „Čína šikanuje Tchaj-wan“ a „Čína se chystá napadnout Tchaj-wan“.

Příklad 6:

Stejně jako USA, po desetiletích politických bojů, korupce a nekompetentnosti v řízení ekonomiky a modernizace infrastruktury, i Tchaj-wan trpěl řadou problémů, včetně nedostatku elektřiny, který vyžaduje přidělování v jednotlivých oblastech. Informace o přidělu energie jsou tedy obyvatelům k dispozici, aby si mohli ověřit, kdy bude v jejich oblasti odpojeno napájení a na jak dlouho. Taková situace je již několik let novým normálem. Nepříznivě to ovlivnilo

obchodní aktivity a poškodilo zahraniční investice. V důsledku toho je míra nezaměstnanosti mladých lidí na Tchaj-wanu trvale nad 10 %. A téměř 60 % Tchajwanců pracujících v zámoří odešlo do Číny. Zpráva z roku 2017 od TVBS Taiwan ukázala, že: po dobu 35 let zůstaly tchajwanské začínající mzdy téměř stejné, 70 % tchajwanské mládeže se odmítlo nechat uvěznit v nízkých mzdách a přálo si založit vlastní podnik, aby vydělali více peněz. Magazín Forbes o problému informoval: „Zaměstnanci na Tchaj-wanu mají problémy. Podle tchajwanské národní rady pro rozvoj si v roce 2016 odnesli domů v průměru 1 510 dolarů měsíčně, což je na průmyslově vyspělé asijskou ekonomiku, která se v průběhu desetiletí hodně rozvinula jako Singapur a Jižní Korea, málo.“ V reakci na tak nízké mzdy a problémy se zaměstnáváním, kterým čelí tchajwanská mládež, předseda Xi zrušil požadavek pracovního povolení pro tchajwanské lidi, aby hledali zaměstnání na pevnině. Ve skutečnosti již v roce 2016 Čínský lidový kongres zřídil fond ve výši 40 miliard RMB, aby pomohl usnadnit záměr tchajwanské mládeže založit si vlastní podnikání v Číně.

Západní masmédia opět nemají o tento druh zpráv zájem. Stále budou světu říkat, že Čína šikanuje Tchaj-wan.

Příklad 7:

Přihlaste se k odběru nových sloupců

Existuje příliš mnoho příběhů o vládě ČLR (od předsedy Maa po předsedu Xi), která rozšiřovala dobrou vůli tchajwanskému lidu a čekala na případné mírové znovusjednocení. Není možné je všechny vyjmenovat. Níže uvádíme několik dalších příkladů:

- Kdykoli dojde k mimořádné události v zámoří, jako je vypuknutí války, čínské velvyslanectví a armáda okamžitě evakuují všechny čínské občany, včetně všech Tchajwanců, kteří požádají do ČLR s tchajwanským krajanským průkazem totožnosti. Klikněte zde pro několik desítek krátkých zpráv a videí.

- Každý Tchajwanec, který se v zámoří dostane do problémů, může snadno vyhledat pomoc na kterékoli z čínských ambasád v příslušné zemi. Několik tchajwanských přátel, které jsem potkal, když jsem v 90. letech pracoval ve východní Evropě se sídlem v Maďarsku, mi řeklo, že zaměstnanci ambasády ČLR jsou užitečnější než zástupce komerční kanceláře ROC.

V roce 2022 Čína vydala Bílou knihu s názvem „Tchajwanská otázka a znovusjednocení Číny v nové éře“ (zde je plný text v angličtině a čínštině). Je trochu delší, ale stojí za přečtení. Politický dokument nastiňuje záměr reintegrovat Tchaj-wan všemi možnými mírovými prostředky a mnoho výhod, které v tomto procesu budou mít Tchajwanští obyvatelé, včetně všech daňových příjmů vybraných na Tchaj-wanu, budou použity výhradně pro sociální blaho tchajwanského lidu a ekonomický rozvoj Tchaj-wanu.

Čína: Neexistuje žádný problém s Tchaj-wanem, pouze problém způsobený Američany.

Čína je zemí s velmi dlouhou historií mírové kultury. Příklady:

- Bývalý malajský premiér Dr. Mahathir řekl : „Vždy říkáme, že máme Čínu jako souseda již 2000 let, nikdy jsme jimi nebyli dobytí. Ale Evropané přišli v roce 1509 a za dva roky dobyli Malajsii.“
- Prezident Východního Timoru Jose Ramos-Horta obhajoval roli Číny jako rostoucí strategické a ekonomické velmoci v Asii a Tichomoří v National Press Club of Australia (2022) argumentem : „Čína sotva kdy napadla jiné země a je nepravděpodobné, že by tak učinila v roce 2022. budoucnost.“
- Indonéský ministr obrany Prabowo Subianto řekl v Singapuru (2022) během rozhovoru pro Aljazeera: „Ale Čína nám také pomohla. Čína nás také bránila a Čína je nyní velmi blízkým partnerem Indonésie. A ve skutečnosti byla Čína vždy vedoucí civilizací v Asii. Mnoho našich sultánů, králů, našich knížat se v té době oženilo s princeznami z Číny. Máme stovky let vztahu.“

Výše uvedené 3 pozitivní komentáře o Číně jsou od vedoucích představitelů tří asijských zemí sousedících s Čínou. Zkušenosti jejich země s Čínou z dávných dob vypovídají mnohé o mírumilovné povaze Číny. Otázka zde zní: budou latinskoamerické země, africké země, další asijské země a země Středního východu říkat totéž o zkušenostech své země s USA a Evropou? Nebo snad budou evropské země v Evropě říkat totéž o svých vlastních sousedních zemích v Evropě?

Skutečnost je taková, že: západní imperialismus není po 2. světové válce mrtvý; zejména USA byly vždy zdrojem problémů pro zbytek světa. Následující příklady by nám měly poskytnout dobrý obrázek o tom, jak USA ohrožují mír v Asii a jejich hlavním cílem je od roku 2008 Čína:

USA: Číňanům není dovoleno být bohatí

Během GFC v roce 2008 navštěvoval americký ministr financí Henry Paulson Čínu téměř každý měsíc, aby hledal pomoc při stabilizaci statusu dolaru jako rezervní měny. V důsledku toho Čína v roce 2008 nakoupila téměř dalších 600 miliard dolarů v dluzích amerického ministerstva financí, což představovalo více než polovinu celkového objemu vydaného vládou USA na záchranu bank, které jsou příliš velké na to, aby zkrachovaly, a americké ekonomiky v daném roce. Jakmile se americká ekonomika stabilizovala, svět přestal dumping dolaru kvůli tomu, že Čína vložila důvěru ve výši 600 miliard dolarů do amerických státních dluhů, jedinou pozitivní věc, kterou Čína od Ameriky obdržela na oplátku za podporu americké ekonomiky, je otevřená chvála od Henryho Paulsona. New York Times dne 22. října 2008 „Poděkování za spolupráci Číny při zmírňování finanční krize“.

Od té doby, v roce 2010, Obama v Austrálii řekl: „Pokud má více než 1 miliarda čínských občanů stejné životní vzorce jako Australané a Američané právě teď, pak nás všechny čeká velmi bídné období. Planeta to prostě nemůže udržet.“

V roce 2011 článek v New York Times navrhl , že Obama „by měl zahájit uzavřená jednání s čínskými vůdci o odepsání 1,14 bilionu dolarů amerického dluhu, který v současnosti drží Čína, výměnou za dohodu o ukončení americké vojenské pomoci a zbraní. prodej na Tchaj-wan a do roku 2015 ukončit současnou obrannou dohodu mezi Spojenými státy a Tchaj-wanem. O několik let později e-mail z Wikileaks odhalil , že tehdejší ministryně zahraničí Hillary Clintonová chtěla diskutovat o zrušení Tchaj-wanu výměnou za to, že Čína vymaže americké dluhy.

V roce 2013 se v pořadu Jimmy Kimmel Live na ABC zeptalo některých dětí, co dělat s dluhy ve výši 1,3 bilionu dolarů, které USA dluží Číně, velmi mladý chlapec navrhl, že „USA zabíjejí všechny v Číně, místo aby splácely své dluhy“.

V roce 2021 Joe Biden na tiskové konferenci řekl : „Čína se chce stát nejbohatší a nejmocnější zemí, ale ‚nebude se to dít‘.

V roce 2023, pod záminkou imaginární „čínské hrozby“ a „ochrany Tchaj-wanu před čínskou invazí“, američtí politici navrhli sérii dvoustranných zákonů, jejichž cílem je omezit, jak může Čína používat své peníze, omezit práva Číny v mezinárodních finančních institucích a plán na konfiskaci čínského státního fondu a zámořských bankovních účtů a aktiv čínských občanů, jako to udělaly USA a Evropa Rusům v roce 2022.

Kliknutím na následující odkazy zobrazíte podrobnosti o navrhovaných účtech za „rabování“:

Z výše uvedené řady chování a prohlášení dvou amerických prezidentů, ministra zahraničí, velmi mladého chlapce, amerických médií a 4 politiků, kteří sponzorovali protičínské zákony, je těžké nedospět k závěru o nevděcích. povaha Američanů. Zdálo by se mi, že DNA lupiče je hluboko v krvi a kostech mnoha lidí v americké společnosti (nerad zobecňuji svůj komentář, pokud mě někdo nepřesvědčí, že výše jmenovaná řada chování v americké společnosti je pouze náhodná. !).

Americká vojenská hrozba Číně na prahu Číny.

Ponechme stranou různé záležitosti od hlášeného plánu USA z roku 2012 rozmístit do roku 2020 60 % flotily amerického námořnictva v Asii a Tichomoří a Obamova Pivota z roku 2011 s tajným plánem zahájit válku proti Číně do roku 2030 s koalicí státy, aby vojensky kontrolovaly komerční zásilky do Číny az Číny přes Jihočínská moře, aby omezily svobodu Číny obchodovat se zbytkem světa, a pokud by Čína vzdorovala, vojenská koalice pod vedením USA by začala útočit na Čínu.

John Pilger, oceněný novinář, vytvořil dvouhodinový dokument s podrobnostmi o amerických vojenských základnách kolem Číny a o tom, jak mohou USA plánovat zahájení války s Čínou.

V roce 2017 americký admirál Scott Swift všechny ujistil, že je připraven plnit rozkazy prezidenta Trumpa a odpálit jadernou raketu proti Číně .

V roce 2022 navrhl bývalý poradce pro národní bezpečnost USA Robert O'Brien raději zničit tchajwanské továrny na polovodiče , než je nechat padnout do rukou Číny.

V roce 2023 americký moderátor talk show Garland Nixon na Twitteru napsal , že zasloučenci Bílého domu uvedli, že americký prezident Joe Biden varoval před plánem na „zničení Tchaj-wanu“, když byl dotázán, zda by mohlo dojít k nějaké větší katastrofě, než je ukrajinská krize.

V posledních letech probíhají v USA nekonečné vojenské aktivity a ujednání zaměřené na Čínu. Níže uvádíme několik dalších příkladů:

Zatímco západní média a politici neustále říkají světu, že CHKO je stále agresivnější proti svobodě plavby západních zemí (vojenské) v Jihočínském a Východočínském moři, nedávná zpráva amerického ministerstva obrany odhalila, že „ USA provedly kolem 120 vojenských cvičení ročně se spojenci a partnery v regionu. Je ironií, že taková statistika americké vojenské agrese na prahu Číny nedokázala přitáhnout zájem západních médií.

V roce 2017 USA rozmístily raketový systém THAAD v Jižní Koreji s naprostou ignorací čínského protestu.

V roce 2021 Austrálie dosáhla dohody s USA a Spojeným královstvím o dohodě o jaderné ponorce v hodnotě 386 miliard dolarů s Čínou jako jejich cílem.

V roce 2022 americký ministr obrany Austin oznámil , že: „USA jsou s Čínou v klíčovém bodě a potřebují vojenskou sílu, aby zajistily, že globální normy v 21. století budou určovat americké hodnoty, nikoli pekingské hodnoty. Poté hovořil o nutnosti sladit americký rozpočet jako nikdy předtím s China Challenge. Poté zmínil odhadované náklady ve výši 1,2 bilionu dolarů jako součást velké jaderné triády, kterou provádí rozpočtový úřad Kongresu.

Je třeba poznamenat, že takový dodatečný rozpočet na vojenské výdaje je nad rámec skutečnosti, že americká armáda již utratila více než dalších 10 zemí dohromady .

- V červenci 2023 americká jaderná ponorka USS Kentucky (schopná odpalovat jaderné balistické střely) náhle dorazila do Busanu v Jižní Koreji.
- V červenci 2023 se šéf NATO Jens Stoltenberg znovu zasadil o posílení vazeb s Asií se záměrem vytvořit asijskou alianci NATO. Bývalý australský premiér Paul Keating označil Stoltenberga za „nejvyššího blázna“ a „nehodu na cestě k nehodě“.

K ospravedlnění záměru NATO zříditi svou vojenskou přítomnost v Asii se NATO zapojilo do série pošpiněných kampaní proti imaginárním čínským hrozbám založeným na chování NATO v minulosti po celém světě. Poslední pomlouvavá kampaň byla v komuniké ze summitu NATO ve Vilnius. V důsledku toho stálý představitel Číny při OSN vyvrátil falešná obvinění NATO proti Číně a napadá NATO, pokud může vznést stejná tvrzení jako Čína v následujících 6 bodech :

1. Čína nikdy nenapadla jiné země.
2. Čína se nikdy nezapojila do zástupných válek.
3. Čína nikdy neprováděla vojenské operace po celém světě.
4. Čína neohrožovala jiné země silou.

5. Čína nevyvážela ideologii.

6. Čína nezasahovala do vnitřních záležitostí jiných zemí.

Realita je taková, že USA zahájily totální nepřátelství proti Číně poté, co Čína pomohla USA z GFC v roce 2008. Příklady:

1. Obamův pacifický_pivot ;

2. Obamova TPP k vyloučení Číny z mezinárodního obchodu ;

3. Trump a Biden totální obchodní války.

4. Trump a Biden totální technologické války.

5. Rozmístění americké armády a vojenské aktivity kolem Číny.

Navzdory tomu, že USA již mají 313 ze svých 750 světových vojenských základen obklopujících Čínu , USA nedávno pokračovaly v expanzi o další 4 přes Filipíny, přičemž 3 z nich byly blízko Tchaj-wanu .

Navzdory tomu, že minulé americké administrativy (1972, 1979, 1982) uzavřely 3 společné komuniké s Čínou o otázce Tchaj-wanu (dohody jedné Číny), američtí politici v průběhu let svými vlastními činy brutálně porušovali všechny písemné dohody s Čínou. Čína je politika jedné Číny. Poslední vývoj je nejhorší:

V červenci 2023 schválila americká sněmovna dodatek k National Defense Authorization Act, který zakazuje na mapách Pentagonu zobrazovat Tchaj-wan a jeho hlavní odlehlé ostrovy, Kinmen, Penghu, Mazudao, Wuchudao a Ludao (atd.) jako součást Číny. (Zde je obsah původního pozměňovacího návrhu).

Níže je jen stručný seznam příkladů, kdy USA porušily všechny své podepsané dokumenty jedné Číny s Čínou, aby vyvolaly válku o Tchaj-wan:

V roce 2021 přinesl Taiwan English News zprávu o „Pentagonu zdvojnásobil počet amerických vojáků na Tchaj-wanu“.

V roce 2022 VOA (čínské zprávy) oznámilo , že USA opět zvýšily počet svých vojenských pracovníků na Tchaj-wanu. Záměrem je pomoci koordinovat obě armády v možné budoucí válce s Čínou.

V dubnu 2023 se americký zákonodárce, předseda zahraničního výboru Sněmovny reprezentantů USA Michael McCaul zavázal , že pomůže zajistit výcvik tchajwanských ozbrojených sil a urychlí dodávky zbraní.

V červnu 2023 vydala webová stránka Taiwan (ROC) Foreign Affair tiskovou zprávu s názvem „ Vláda USA oficiálně informuje Tchaj-wan o nejnovějších prodejkách zbraní “.

V červenci 2023 bylo na Tchaj-wanu široce hlášeno, že USA chtějí, aby Tchaj-wan zřídil biologickou laboratoř P4. Yahoo Chinese News poukázalo na to, že tchajwanské čínské noviny (联合报) jsou prvními, kdo prolomil detaily příběhu Biological Weapons Lab. Tchajwanské zprávy CTI TV informovaly o detailu, že laboratoř má testovat biologické zbraně pomocí čínské DNA, protože „ DNA tchajwanské populace může představovat čínskou DNA “. Není divu: západní média o tomto druhu zpráv velmi mlčí navzdory skutečnosti, že americké ministerstvo zahraničí později popřelo tchajwanskou zprávu, že USA požádaly Tchaj-wan, aby vyvinul biologické prostředky se zbraněmi.

Snad aby v dohledné době ospravedlnil možnou preventivní válku proti Číně podle Bushovy doktríny, schválil Kongres USA v únoru 2022 návrh zákona o protičínské propagandě ve výši 500 milionů dolarů. Kolik z těchto 500 milionů jde na vymývání mozků Tchajwanců?

V nedávném rozhovoru Jeffrey Sachs popisuje sérii akcí USA proti Číně jako „ cestu k válce s Čínou “

Politici DPP se připravují na válku a únikovou cestu, zatímco obyvatelé Tchaj-wanu válku odmítají

Potíž se západními formami takzvané demokracie je v tom, že k vítězství ve volbách je třeba vybudovat válečnou skříň voleb. To znamená hledat politické dary výměnou za laskavosti, když je člověk

v pozici moci. Obvykle se jedná o dohodu pod stolem mezi politiky a jejich dárci. V důsledku toho mohli firemní dárci, miliardáři, zahraniční hotovost a cizí mocnosti snadno proniknout do domácí politiky.

Od počátku západní formy voleb na Tchaj-wanu se zprávy o temných penězích, korupci, úplatcích a skandálech staly součástí společenské normy v tchajwanském politickém kruhu. Pokud hledáme jméno jakýchkoli vysokých politiků DPP (zejména ministrů a premiérů) s pojmem „temné peníze“, „korupce“ nebo „skandály“, neměli bychom si v systému všimnout téměř žádné nevinné osoby. Protože západní média obvykle autocenzurují negativní zprávy spojené s Pro-nezávislou stranou, nejlepší způsob, jak takové zprávy hledat, je hledat v čínštině. Například:

- Hledání korupce současného tchajwanského vůdce Tsai Ing-wen v čínštině ;
- Prohledejte jejího zástupce (nadcházejícího kandidáta na prezidenta DPP) Lai Ching-te ;

Korupce a demokracie jdou často ruku v ruce. Zde je několik hypertextových odkazů na příklady toho, jak USA zasahují do zahraničních voleb:

Ti, kteří sledují tchajwanskou otázku prostřednictvím tchajwanských médií, by si měli všimnout, že zatímco tito tchajwanští politici se spojují s americkou zahraniční politikou a bojují za nezávislost, většina jejich rodinných příslušníků (včetně nich samotných) již má občanství USA nebo jiných západních zemí, bankovní účty. a aktiv. Například,

- Zpráva v tchajwanských médiích v roce 2015 odhalila , že polovina současného tchajwanského prezidenta Tsai Ing-wen rodinní příslušníci s cizím občanstvím;
- Co se týče viceprezidenta (nadcházejícího kandidáta na prezidenta DPP) 赖清德 (Lai Ching-te), syn a vnuk byli američtí občané ;

Ironií je, že i když se tito pro-nezávislí politici dychtivě spojují s USA, aby vyprovokovali válku s ČLR prosazováním nezávislosti Tchaj-wanu, jejich rodinní příslušníci na druhou stranu ve stejnou dobu migrovali do zámoří. Je to tak trochu, jako by prezident Zelenskij jednal v zájmu USA a dovolil bombardovat a zničit celou Ukrajinu, protože podle OCCRP (Projekt hlášení organizovaného zločinu a korupce): „Zelenskij a jeho nejbližší okolí nevysvětlili miliardy dolarů zámoří.“

Ve skutečnosti je během tchajwanských vojenských cvičení jeden z jejich programů o tom, jak by mohl prezident bezpečně uprchnout, pokud vypukne válka (Samozřejmě, kdykoli tchajwanská média informovala o takových podrobnostech o útěku, ministerstvo obrany to popře.)

Tragédií pro průměrné tchajwanské obyvatelstvo je, že ekonomika ostrova byla poškozena již předtím, než taková válka začala. Podle nedávné zprávy Financial Times: „ Lidé jsou nervózní: tchajwanští bohatí úkryty v zámoří ve strachu z čínského konfliktu “. Totéž se stalo zahraničním společenstvem na Tchaj-wanu, kde „polovina zahraničních společností na Tchaj-wanu vytvořila nouzové plány kvůli obavám z evakuací a narušení dodavatelského řetězce “. Poslední Tchaj-wan HDP klesl o 3,02 % .

Realita na Tchaj-wanu je taková, že mnoho mladých lidí odmítá vstoupit do armády a vláda DPP má problém s náborem nových vojáků . Jako výsledek:

- Vláda DPP rozhodla o prodloužení doby služby stávajících vojáků o další rok.
- V červnu 2023 Tchaj-wan pozměnil nařízení o náboru vojáků tak, aby zahrnoval rekruty z Hongkongu a Macaa, kteří pracují a žijí na Tchaj-wanu.
- I v červnu vláda DPP údajně spolupracovala s ministerstvem školství na zavedení univerzitního programu 3 + 1 . To jsou 3 roky studia plus rok vojenského výcviku.

V únoru 2023 místní zákonodárci na ostrově Jinmen odhlasovali prohlášení Jinmen za nevojenskou zónu a guvernér Jinmen Li Zhufeng (李炷烽) navrhuje použít ostrov Jinmen jako pilotní program pro systémy One Country Two a postupně se rozšiřovat. Profesor John V. Wash v nedávném článku nazvaném „Vyzbrojování Tchaj-wanu je šílená provokace“ citoval hypertextový odkaz na průzkum z roku 2022, který ukázal, že drtivá většina (82,1 %) Tchajwanců by nyní chtěla zachovat status quo, přičemž pouze 5,3 % chce okamžitou nezávislost."

Jak dlouho ještě bude Čína tolerovat nekonečné eskalující vojenské provokace USA?

V červenci 2023 maďarský premiér Orban poznámeneal , že „Peking se za 30 let dokázal vyvinout stejně jako jiné země za 200 let. Proto si mohou nárokovat své „místo pod sluncem“. Washington však neakceptuje tento rychlý vývoj, skutečnost, že je Čína v mnoha sektorech předběhla... V důsledku toho je střet dvou světových velmocí nevyhnutelný.... Válka není nevyhnutelná, ale USA nepřijímají, že se staly druhým nejmocnějším národem světa, dodal Orbán.

Článek na Education Monitor News správně poukázal na to, že „Největší hrozbou pro USA není Čína, ale mír“.

V roce 2014 zveřejnil New York Times článek s názvem „Nedostatek velkých válek může škodit hospodářskému růstu“.

Měli bychom mít na paměti, že USA byly vytvořeny na základě invaze, masakru, rabování a zotročování druhých. Ani jedna věc, kterou dnes USA vlastní, není mírovými prostředky, včetně každého centimetru jejich současného území.

Od roku 2008 si Čína již uvědomovala, že její laskavost vůči USA bude vnímána pouze jako slabost. To jen podpoří další agresi a chamtivost amerických imperialistických vládců. Takže první věc, kterou předseda Xi udělal po svém nástupu do úřadu v roce 2012, byla návštěva vojenské základny CHKO. Otevřeně vyzval PLA, aby se připravila na válku a vyhrála válku .

V únoru 2023 Čína vydala zprávu nazvanou „Hegemonie USA a její nebezpečí“ a v květnu „Americká donucovací diplomacie a její poškozování“ popisující mnoho zločinů spáchaných USA proti světu a že Čína již nemá zájem vyhovět Zločiny a chování USA.



V březnu 2023 čínská vládní webová stránka oznámila, že předseda Si Ťin-pching řekl skupině více než 300 vysoce postavených vládních úředníků, že: „Historie opakovaně prokázala, že pokud budeme hledat bezpečnost prostřednictvím řešení, bezpečnost zvítězí; Budeme-li hledat bezpečnost prostřednictvím ústupků, bezpečnost zanikne; Budeme-li hledat rozvoj prostřednictvím odhodlání, rozvoj bude prosperovat; Pokud budeme hledat rozvoj prostřednictvím kompromisů, náš vývoj utrpí.“

V červnu 2023 Čína vydala Zákon o zahraničních vztazích Čínské lidové republiky, který nastiňuje postoj země k zahraničním vztahům, chartám OSN, mezinárodním zákonům a možným protiakcím proti jakékoli nepřátelské zahraniční politice a chování, které poškozuje čínské zájmy a bezpečnost.

V červenci Čína označila NATO za „způsobovatele problémů“ a vydala NATO varování: „Peking nezpůsobuje potíže, ale nebojí se problémů“. O několik dní později vydal čínský velvyslanec v USA přímé varování Washingtonu: "Pokud mě lidé poruší, vrátím úder." Jak dlouho tedy bude Čína nadále tolerovat provokace USA? Jak dlouho Čína dovolí americké armádě pokračovat v porušování její suverenity na Tchaj-wanu? Poskytne Čína USA více času na vyzbrojení Tchaj-wanu, jako to udělali na Ukrajině, než Putin přestal tolerovat hrozby a byl nucen podniknout vojenskou akci?

Wei Ling Chua je autorem knihy Demokracie: Co se může Západ naučit od Číny a „masakru“ na náměstí Nebeského klidu? Síla slov vs. Tiché důkazy.

Přihlaste se k odběru nových sloupců

It is certainly the case that the US is attempting to 'Ukraine' Taiwan. However, unlike the Ukraine, there is no realistic logistical way the US can support Taiwan Island in any ongoing military sense, without resorting to total war against the mainland. This is different from the Ukraine situation, where the US/NATO has waged a failed economic war against Russia, but has not had to directly attack the country in order to support their on-going war against Russia, using the Ukraine as proxy.

Pace US/NATO, there is currently no analogous NATO-like military pact to assist the US in any hot war against China. The US is attempting to get Japan on board, but I suspect the Japanese are frankly not interested in actual warfare.

Which leaves Australia, and possibly the Philippines, in a supporting role. But even those countries would no doubt think twice before participating in any actual shooting war against China.

Currently, the US is waging economic war against mainland China, with quite limited success. The longer that goes on, the less effective it will be, as Chinese industry adapts, accordingly.

It is also the case that if the US would cease military support of the DPP, the island and mainland would attempt to resolve their differences peacefully, through political means supported via mutual trade. However, like Ukraine, the US is not interested in accepting a peaceful solution.

The fact that historical (even recent history) understanding among island youth is poor, is typical for the age. My guess is, however, that Taiwan youth are less ignorant than most

American youth, when it comes to their history, both recent and old. But that is not saying much.

As a professional in the area of computer systems, let me say that Dutton is being a bit optimistic.

Current software design produces integrated, or “monolithic”, systems, and does so at high cost by a smart design team. The financial concept is that a capital investment produces a revenue (or savings) stream whose present value exceeds the capital investment. In classical engineering economics, one has a capital investment, a revenue/savings stream, a decommissioning cost – salvage value. Replacement cost is considered to be another problem — you might not want to replace the system, or costs might not be predictable.

This works well for cars, dams, houses, assembly lines, ever so many things.

Trouble is, it doesn't work for software, and it doesn't work because software doesn't physically wear out. Managers assume that software will last forever. Trouble is, it won't.

Software must be changed each time there is a change in task, which happens frequently. Many changes conflict with the initial design (perhaps because government regulations change, perhaps because the designers didn't design right, etc.), and these changes require “work arounds” that destroy the simple initial design architecture. The result is the “big ball of mud” problem — <https://joeyoder.com/PDFs/mud.pdf> . See other pathologies, which can occur both in initial design and maintenance/refurbishment projects in: <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Anti-pattern> .

The result is that software *does* wear out. Subordinate managers try to conceal this from upper layers of management in order to “get through their assignment” and be promoted. Reporting trouble is not a path to advancement, or even retention. Eventually, maintenance efforts introduce more than one error for each error fixed, the trouble causes a catastrophic (origin: “destroying blow”) failure that cannot be covered up. That’s the failure Dutton brings up, and it’s also the failure that shut down United Airlines yesterday (2023-09-05). The management response is to

Management, composed of incompetent but personable political idiots on a good day, and uniformed by their subordinates, of course has no idea such failures are on the way. They are faced with a surprise major capital cost and a prolonged reduction (or elimination) of anticipated savings or revenue.

And, today, they are faced with a major shortage of dependable software types. The original software people are gone.

Once I built a railroad, now it’s done.
Buddy, can you spare a dime? . . .

And the new guys are part of the “cover up” culture because only coverup culture members have survived in their jobs. Sketchily trained, not terribly smart, but full of ego and quite willing to cite management for “ableism”, failure of DIE and ESG, and racism.

And right here, I join up with Dutton. It’s the population’s lower IQ that sets up such projects. Further, it’s the Western political system that enforces toleration of incompetence. Full commitment to a political organization/cult is the important part

of a career, ability to cope with physical reality is discouraged because it can and does reduce commitment. Such a system is almost unbelievably stupid, and that's why we have it — we as a population are unbelievably stupid.

So we can't depend on "technology" (means "equipment" or "magic") to save us. At best, we'd get the almost inoperative automation of "Idiocracy".

The Hidden Agenda Behind Taiwanese Independence!

At that time, there were approximately 300,000 Japanese imperial subjects who renounced their Japanese citizenship and became nationals of the Republic of China, taking root in Taiwan. These individuals did not dare to make waves during the early days of the government’s rule, under both Chiang regimes. However, under the leadership of Lee Teng-hui and Chen Shui-bian, they emerged in various fields, including politics, academia, and business. When Taiwan was recovered, the Japanese imperial subjects who were repatriated to Japan left behind real estate, shops, and houses. These properties could not be taken with them, so they were sold at low prices to Taiwanese people or given as gifts to local residents. This fact is supported by newspaper reports from Taiwan Province's Japanese Property Cleanup Office, published on August 16, 1949. Some people claimed that Japan could govern Taiwan as long as they had a leader, implying that the Japanese tourists visiting Taiwan would be their future rulers. The first generation of Japanese imperial subjects

I am now 82 years old and could have lived my remaining years in peace without getting involved in national and societal turmoil. However, in recent days, I have seen news reports about Taiwanese independence advocates causing trouble. I am only guided by my conscience in providing the historical facts mentioned above for reference. Due to my age and frailty, seeing unfairness affect my emotions, I have written this piece intermittently over several days. I am not submitting it for publication; I am simply providing historical facts to awaken the memory of our fellow citizens and expose the background of the remaining Japanese imperial subjects in Taiwan who hide behind a facade of sheep but are actually wolves. I hope to make the truth clear to the people of Taiwan so that they have nowhere to hide. In the early days, Taiwanese patriot Yang Kuang believed that Taiwan is an inseparable part of China, sharing the same roots, language, and culture. Despite some unpleasant historical destinies, the truth is as such.

It's a pity that these remnants of imperial subjects have disrupted the once-beautiful Taiwan. How can one not feel heartbroken?

Foundations of the United Nations were laid by the United States, the United Kingdom, and the Soviet Union, from August 21 to September 28, 1944, in the Dumbarton Oaks Conference in Washington. Immediately afterward, the Republic of China became one of the five founding nations, and was given lifetime membership in the Security Council. Her population was larger than 3/4 of the nations who held membership in the UN. Even in Taiwan, she maintained diplomatic relationship with 60 countries of the world. In the field of commerce, she exported over a billion dollars’ worth of merchandise annually, and yet when Albania, with a population half the size of Philadelphia, made a motion that the Republic of China be expelled, the smaller nations rallied to the suggestion in a demonstration of emotionalism and bias that left a permanent blemish on the record of the UN. Ambassador Bush said on October 25, 1971,

“Never have I seen such hate.”

The late David Lawrence, respected news journalist and editor of the U.S. News & World Report, said,

“Can any nation be safe in an atmosphere of such irresponsible and emotional action?”

The Chinese leaders returned to Taiwan in tears. They carried with them a record free from blot or blemish. Their dues had been paid. Their position had been held with honor. But without a single grievance against them, they were expelled and not even granted the courtesy of being permitted to speak for themselves. Someone dared to suggest before their departure that perhaps Communist China and Nationalist China could each have a seat' The pro-Communist block pounded their desks and shouted down the proposal. a few days later they were willing to talk about two seats being given to both West Germany and Communist East Germany, to sit side by side. Come on, littlereddot, have you no sense of balance, an awareness that most events were not extreme situations of black or white, just or unjust. Have you no sense of history?

I read this article, and my reaction is that it is not a fair and balanced account of truth, rather it is a mountain of propaganda designed to offset its opposing mountain of propaganda, that is the mainstream narrative in the west. The writer fails to mention the background: The Han defeated the Hui Muslims in a bloody war, put all the men to the sword, took the women as slaves and captives, and

CASTRATED the young boys, including Zheng He. That's right, folks. The "Chinese Mulsim" was a castrato, one of the few who survived the terrible operation. If they survived, the Han figured that they were tough material and could be put to use. Zheng He proved to be of great use. That doesn't change the fact that they castrated him as a child.

Now, some more context. Wei Ling Chua presents the issue of the ROC and its constitution as if nobody in Taiwan understands anything about what it says and the populace is happy with it and chooses to keep it. This so seems to miss the point while acknowledging it as well. The point is not what would happen if the US withdrew its interest in Taiwan as a game chip in its fight against the PRC. The point is that Taiwan is an accident in the history of that struggle which remains useful.

The Communist rule of China has generally been opposed by the US for the same reasons Communist rule in Russia was opposed. By the end of the second world war Chiang Kai Shek was heavily supported by the the US against Mao and the PRC. The withdrawal of the ROC armies to Taiwan did not end the war even if there was nothing practical that could be done about it. Throughout the remaing years of Chaing's lifetime the hope of mounting an invasion to retake the mainland was kept alive.

Whatever the legalistic talk, whatever concessions to PRC rule on the mainland over the following decades, the political fact is that the US is till interested in the disposal of the PRC so the historical situation created by the ROC government's withdrawal to Taiwan is still meaningful as a means of organizing opposition to the PRC. There is nothing particularly honest or forthright in the legalities. Deals of expediency have been struck as necessary. The animosity of the US remains and that is the major fact. The ROC and Taiwan remain of practical interest to that animosity.

Whatever might be of benefit to many people will not sway the current trustees of that animosity. Behind all the legalisms this animosity of the US government remains. China under the PRC remains a thorn in the throat of US world ambitions. A resolution is necessary.

Although the video linked below is a year old, the facts since then haven't changed. At that time, ASML had sold and delivered only 120 EUV lithography machines at a cost of over US\$200 million each. Not one was sold to China, as the US pressured Holland to withhold the necessary export license. China's semiconductor fabs, SMIC being the biggest and most advanced, do not have access to EUV lithography machines, which are necessary for the production 5nm and 3nm nodes. Take a look at that video to understand the complexity of these machines, which are actually 7 machines, all manufactured in different places around the world. They are then assembled in Holland and shipped. Now I know that China has been miraculous at fast development of technology, but this nut isn't going to be easy to crack. ASML is the ONLY company in the world that has developed and sold this technology, and they needed investment from their customers, TSMC and Samsung, to have the necessary resources to do so. The Japanese, also strong in lithography, have been unable to build EUV machines. China WILL eventually dominate the chip industry, but cutting edge chips will take much longer than 5 years. Some may argue that Huawei's new phone, made with all domestic components including a 7nm chip manufactured by SMIC, demonstrates that China doesn't need EUV lithography. That's incorrect. TSMC makes 5nm and 3nm chips, and they're developing the next generation, 2nm. By the way, at this point, the numbers (5nm,

3nm, 2nm) no longer represent size; instead they refer to a newer, more highly advanced node. All of these nodes require EUV lithography to manufacture.

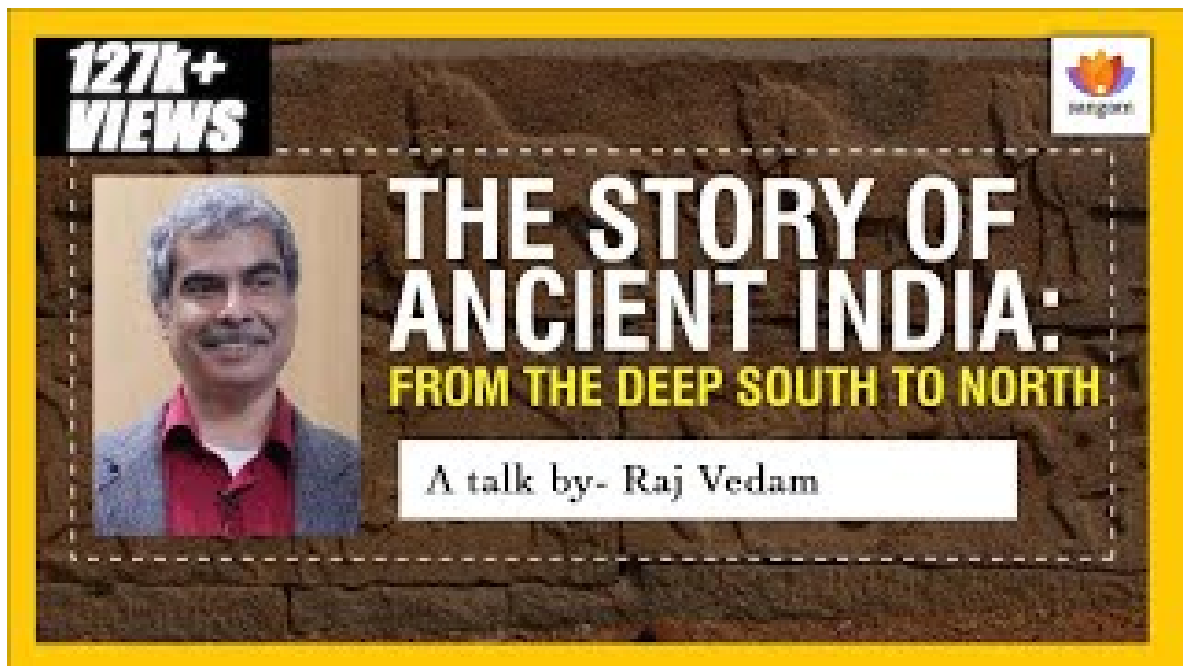
