16. února 2022, celý týden předtím, než Putin vyslal bojové jednotky na Ukrajinu, ukrajinská armáda zahájila těžké bombardování oblasti (na východě Ukrajiny) okupované převážně etnickými Rusy. V okolí se v té době nacházeli představitelé pozorovatelské mise Organizace pro bezpečnost a spolupráci v Evropě (OBSE) a vedli záznamy o ostřelování, jak k němu došlo. OBSE zjistila, že bombardování v průběhu týdne dramaticky zesílilo, až dosáhlo vrcholu 19. února, kdy bylo zaznamenáno celkem 2026 dělostřeleckých úderů. Mějte na paměti, že ukrajinská armáda ve skutečnosti ostřelovala civilní oblasti podél linie kontaktu, které byly obsazeny jinými Ukrajinci.

Chceme zdůraznit, že úředníci z OBSE pracovali v rámci svých profesionálních schopností a shromažďovali důkazy o ostřelování v oblasti z první ruky. **Jejich data ukazují, že ukrajinské síly bombardovaly a zabíjely své vlastní lidi. To vše bylo zdokumentováno a nebylo zpochybněno.** 

Otázka, kterou si musíme všichni položit, je tato: **Je bombardování a vraždění vlastních lidí "válečným aktem"?**

Myslíme si, že ano. A pokud máme pravdu, pak musíme logicky předpokládat, že válka začala před ruskou invazí (která byla zahájena o celý týden později) Musíme také předpokládat, že údajná "nevyprovokovaná agrese" Ruska nebyla vůbec nevyprovokovaná, ale byla vhodnou humanitární reakcí k úmyslnému zabíjení civilistů. Abychom mohli tvrdit, že ruská invaze "nebyla vyprovokována", museli bychom říci, že vypálení více než 4 000 dělostřeleckých granátů do měst a čtvrtí, kde žijí ženy a děti, není provokace? Kdo bude hájit tento názor?

Nikdo, protože je to absurdní. **Zabíjení civilistů na Donbasu bylo jasnou provokací, provokací, která měla za cíl přimět Rusko k válce** . A – jak jsme řekli dříve – OBSE měla na místě monitory, které poskytly úplnou dokumentaci ostřelování, jak k němu došlo, což je tak blízko **železnému svědectví očitých svědků**, jak jen můžete získat.

To je samozřejmě velký rozchod s "oficiálním příběhem", který označuje Rusko za pachatele nepřátelství. Ale jak jsme ukázali, tak to prostě není. Oficiální popis je špatný. I tak vás možná nepřekvapí, že většina mainstreamových médií zcela vynechala jakékoli zpravodajství o činnostech OBSE na zjišťování faktů na východní Ukrajině. Jedinou výjimkou byla agentura Reuters, která zveřejnila záměrně neprůhledný účet zveřejněný 18. února s názvem "Rusko hlásí poplach kvůli prudkému nárůstu ostřelování Donbasu". Zde je úryvek:

Ruský ministr zahraničí Sergej Lavrov v pátek vyjádřil znepokojení nad prudkým nárůstem ostřelování na východní Ukrajině a obvinil zvláštní monitorovací misi OBSE, že zamlčuje to, co podle něj bylo ukrajinským porušováním mírového procesu...

Washington a jeho spojenci vyvolali obavy, že nárůst násilí na Donbasu by mohl být součástí ruské záminky k invazi na Ukrajinu. Napětí je již nyní vysoké kvůli hromadění ruské armády na severu, východě a jihu Ukrajiny.

"Jsme velmi znepokojeni zprávami z posledních dnů - včera a předevčírem došlo k prudkému nárůstu ostřelování zbraněmi, které jsou podle minských dohod zakázány," řekl Lavrov s odkazem na mírové dohody zaměřené na ukončení konfliktu. "Zatím vidíme, že speciální monitorovací mise dělá vše, co je v jejích silách, aby vyřešila všechny otázky, které ukazují na vinu ukrajinských ozbrojených sil," řekl na tiskové konferenci. Ukrajinská armáda v pátek popřela, že by porušila mírový proces v Minsku, a obvinila Moskvu, že vede informační válku, aby prohlásila, že Kyjev ostřeluje civilisty, přičemž obvinění jsou podle ní lži a mají to vyprovokovat. ( <u>Rusko je znepokojeno prudkým nárůstem ostřelování Donbasu</u>, Reuters)

Všimněte si chytrého způsobu, jakým agentura Reuters rámuje své zpravodajství tak, aby tvrzení ukrajinské armády byla přikládána stejně důvěryhodnosti jako tvrzení ruského ministra zahraničí. Agentura Reuters nedokáže poukázat na to, že zpráva OBSE ověřuje Lavrovovu verzi událostí a zároveň vyvrací

**tvrzení Ukrajinců.** Úkolem novináře je rozlišovat mezi skutečností a fikcí, ale znovu vidíme, že agendy řízené zprávy nemají informovat, ale zavádět.

I would ask those politicians and pundits in Washington, DC who are agitating for pouring more weapons into Ukraine how the United States would react if Russia was arming Mexican drug cartels with weapons that were killing American citizens? You know the answer. The American public would be howling in rage and demand retaliation. If you think that Russians, whose history is written in the blood of centuries of invaders, do not care about the threat that NATO presents on its western border then you know nothing of Russia's tenacity in beating back such threats. These are very dangerous times.

Myšlenka, kterou se snažíme udělat, je jednoduchá: Válku na Ukrajině nezahájil tyranský ruský vůdce (Putin) usilující o obnovu Sovětského impéria. Tento příběh je podvodem, který dali dohromady neokonzervativci, kteří se snažili získat veřejnou podporu pro válku s Ruskem. Fakta, která zde uvádím, lze identifikovat na mapě, kde k skutečným výbuchům došlo, a poté je zaznamenali úředníci, jejichž úkolem bylo splnit právě tento úkol. Vidíte rozdíl mezi těmito dvěma? A tady je ještě něco, co je obvykle vyloučeno ze selektivního pokrytí médií. Než Putin poslal své tanky přes hranici na Ukrajinu, odvolal se na článek 51 Organizace spojených národů, který poskytuje právní ospravedlnění vojenské intervence.

Samozřejmě, že to Spojené státy udělaly mnohokrát, aby poskytly fíkový list legitimitě svým četným vojenským intervencím. Ale v tomto případě můžete vidět, kde by mohla být takzvaná
Responsibility To Protect (R2P) ve skutečnosti ospravedlněna, koneckonců podle většiny odhadů ukrajinská armáda od převratu podporovaného USA před 8 lety zabila přes 14 000 etnických Rusů. .

Pokud někdy nastala situace, ve které mohla být obranná vojenská operace ospravedlněna, byla to právě tato. Ale to stále plně nevysvětluje, proč Putin použil článek 51 OSN. Za tímto účelem se obracíme na bývalého zbrojního inspektora Scotta Rittera, který to vysvětlil takto:

"Ruský prezident Vladimir Putin s odkazem na článek 51 jako svou pravomoc nařídil to, co nazval "zvláštní vojenskou operací"...

podle článku 51 nemůže být pochyb o oprávněnosti ruského tvrzení, že rusky mluvící obyvatelstvo Donbasu bylo vystaveno brutálnímu osmiletému bombardování, které zabilo tisíce lidí ... Navíc Rusko tvrdí, že mít dokumentární důkaz, že ukrajinská armáda se připravovala na masivní vojenskou invazi do Donbasu, kterou předcházela Ruskem vedená "zvláštní vojenská operace". [Údaje OBSE ukazují nárůst vládního ostřelování oblasti ve dnech před nastěhováním Ruska.]

"Sečteno a podtrženo, Rusko předložilo rozpoznatelný nárok v rámci doktríny předvídatelné kolektivní sebeobrany, kterou původně vymyslely USA a NATO, protože se vztahuje na článek 51, který je založen na skutečnosti, nikoli na fikci.

I když by mohlo být v módě, aby lidé, organizace a vlády na Západě přijali ukvapený závěr, že ruská vojenská intervence představuje svévolné porušení Charty Organizace spojených národů a jako taková představuje nezákonnou útočnou válku , pravdou je, že ze všech tvrzení týkajících se zákonnosti preempce podle článku 51 Charty Organizace spojených národů má Rusko ospravedlnění pro invazi na Ukrajinu na pevném právním základě. (" Rusko, Ukrajina a válečné právo: Zločin agrese", Zprávy konsorcia)

# Zde je trochu více pozadí z článku zahraničněpolitického analytika Daniala Kovalika:

"Tuto diskuzi je třeba začít tím, že přijmeme skutečnost, že na Ukrajině již probíhala válka po dobu osmi let před ruskou vojenskou invazí v únoru 2022. A tato válka vlády v Kyjevě... si vyžádala životy asi 14 000 lidí." mnoho z nich jsou děti a dalších asi 1,5 milionu vysídlili... Ve světle výše uvedeného soudím, že Rusko mělo právo jednat ve vlastní sebeobraně intervencí na Ukrajině, která se stala zástupcem USA a NATO pro útok – nejen na ruská etnika uvnitř Ukrajinu, ale i samotné Rusko. ("<u>Proč je ruská intervence na Ukrajině podle mezinárodního práva legální", RT</u>)

Informoval tedy někdo ze západních médií o tom, že Putin před zahájením speciální vojenské operace použil článek 51 OSN? Ne, neudělali, protože by to znamenalo přiznání, že Putinova vojenská operace je v souladu s mezinárodním právem. Místo toho média nadále šíří fikci, že "Hitler-Putin se snaží obnovit sovětské impérium", což je tvrzení, pro které neexistují žádné důkazy. Mějte na paměti, že Putinova operace nezahrnuje svržení cizí vlády za

účelem instalace loutky podporované Moskvou, vyzbrojení a výcvik cizí armády, která bude použita jako zástupce v boji proti geopolitickému rivalovi, ani nacpání země státem. nejmodernější zbraně k dosažení vlastních úzkých strategických cílů nebo páchání teroristických činů průmyslové sabotáže (Nord-Stream 2), aby zabránily ekonomické integraci Asie a Evropy. Ne, Putin se do žádné z těchto věcí nezapojil. Ale Washington určitě má, protože Washington není omezen mezinárodním právem. V očích Washingtonu je mezinárodní právo pouhou nepříjemností, nad kterou se přezíravě krčí rameny, kdykoli je vyžadována jednostranná akce. Ale Putin není v takových věcech zdaleka tak kavalír, ve skutečnosti má dlouhou historii hraní podle pravidel, protože věří, že pravidla pomáhají posílit bezpečnost všech. A má pravdu; dělají. A proto se odvolal na článek 51, než vyslal vojáky na pomoc lidem na Donbasu. Cítil, že má morální povinnost poskytnout jim pomoc, ale chtěl, aby jeho činy byly v souladu s mezinárodním právem. Myslíme si, že dosáhl obojího.

Furthermore, we have about 50% of the world's wealth but only 6.3% of its population. This disparity is particularly great as between ourselves and the peoples of Asia. In this situation, we cannot fail to be the object of envy and resentment. Our real task in the coming period is to devise a pattern of relationships which will permit us to maintain this position of disparity without positive detriment to our national security. To do so, we will have to dispense with all sentimentality and daydreaming; and our attention will have to be concentrated everywhere on our immediate national objectives. We need not deceive ourselves that we can afford today the luxury of altruism and world-benefaction.

Americký imperiální plánovač George Kennan, architekt první studené války, v roce 1948 napsal: "Máme asi 50 % světového bohatství, ale pouze 6,3 % jeho populace" "Naším skutečným úkolem" je "udržet tuto disparitu" <u>@BenjaminNorton</u>

Tady je ještě něco, co v západních médiích nikdy neuvidíte. Nikdy neuvidíte skutečný text Putinových bezpečnostních požadavků, které byly vzneseny celé 2 měsíce před vypuknutím války. A důvod, proč je neuvidíte, je ten, že jeho požadavky byly legitimní, rozumné a nezbytné. Jediné, co Putin chtěl, bylo základní ujištění, že NATO neplánuje umístit své základny, armády a raketové základny na hranici Ruska. Jinými slovy, dělal totéž, co dělají všichni zodpovědní vůdci, aby bránili bezpečnost a ochranu svých vlastních lidí.

Zde je několik kritických úryvků z textu Putinova návrhu pro USA a NATO:

#### Článek 1

Strany budou spolupracovat na základě zásad nedělitelné, rovné a neomezené bezpečnosti a za tímto účelem:

nebude podnikat akce ani se účastnit nebo podporovat činnosti, které ovlivňují bezpečnost druhé strany;

neprovede bezpečnostní opatření přijatá každou stranou jednotlivě nebo v rámci mezinárodní organizace, vojenské aliance nebo koalice, která by mohla ohrozit základní bezpečnostní zájmy druhé strany.

#### článek 3

Strany **nevyužijí území jiných států** k přípravě nebo **provedení ozbrojeného útoku proti druhé straně** nebo k jiným akcím ovlivňujícím základní bezpečnostní zájmy druhé strany. **článek 4** 

Spojené státy americké se zavazují zabránit dalšímu rozšiřování Severoatlantické aliance na východ a odepřít přistoupení k Alianci státům bývalého Svazu sovětských socialistických republik.

Spojené státy americké nezřizují vojenské základny na území států bývalého Svazu sovětských socialistických republik, které nejsou členy Severoatlantické aliance, nevyužívají jejich infrastrukturu k jakýmkoli vojenským aktivitám ani s nimi nerozvíjejí dvoustrannou vojenskou spolupráci.

#### článek 5

Strany se zdrží rozmisťování svých ozbrojených sil a výzbroje , a to i v rámci mezinárodních organizací, vojenských aliancí nebo koalic, v oblastech , kde by takové nasazení mohlo být druhou stranou vnímáno jako ohrožení své národní bezpečnosti , s výjimkou takové rozmístění na vnitrostátních územích smluvních stran.

Strany se zdrží létání s těžkými bombardéry vybavenými pro jadernou nebo nejadernou výzbroj nebo rozmisť ování povrchových válečných lodí jakéhokoli typu, a to i v rámci mezinárodních organizací, vojenských aliancí nebo koalic, v oblastech mimo národní vzdušný prostor a národní teritoriální vody. kde mohou útočit na cíle na území druhé strany.

Strany budou udržovat dialog a spolupracovat na zlepšení mechanismů pro předcházení nebezpečným vojenským aktivitám na volném moři a nad ním, včetně dohody o maximální přibližovací vzdálenosti mezi válečnými loděmi a letadly.

#### článek 6

Strany se zavazují, že nebudou rozmisťovat ze země odpalované rakety středního a kratšího doletu mimo svá národní území, jakož i v oblastech svých národních území, ze kterých mohou takové zbraně útočit na cíle na území státu druhé strany.

#### článek 7

Strany se zdrží rozmisťování jaderných zbraní mimo svá národní území a vrátí takové zbraně, které již byly rozmístěny mimo jejich národní území v době vstupu Smlouvy v platnost, na jejich národní území. Strany odstraní veškerou stávající infrastrukturu pro rozmístění jaderných zbraní mimo svá národní území.

Strany nebudou cvičit vojenský a civilní personál z nejaderných zemí v používání jaderných zbraní. Strany nebudou provádět cvičení nebo výcvik pro všeobecné síly, které zahrnují scénáře zahrnující použití jaderných zbraní. ("Aby měl smysl války", Israel Shamir, Unz Review)

Není potřeba génia, aby přišel na to, čeho se Putin obával. **Obával se rozšiřování NATO a zejména vzniku nepřátelské vojenské aliance podporované Washingtonem upravenými nacisty okupujícími území na jeho západním křídle. Bylo to od něj nerozumné?** Měl přijmout tyto rusofoby podporované USA a dovolit jim umístit své rakety na jeho hranici? Bylo by to prozíravé? Co tedy můžeme vyvodit z Putinova seznamu požadavků?

Za prvé, můžeme odvodit, **že se nesnaží rekonstruovat sovětské impérium, jak MSM neúnavně naléhá** . Seznam se zaměřuje výhradně na požadavky související s bezpečností, nic jiného.

Zadruhé to dokazuje, že **by se válce dalo snadno vyhnout, kdyby Zelenskij jednoduše zachoval status quo a formálně oznámil, že Ukrajina zůstane neutrální.** Ve skutečnosti Zelenskyj souhlasil s neutralitou při jednáních s Moskvou v březnu, ale Washington zabránil ukrajinskému prezidentovi, aby dohodu dokončil, což znamená, že za pokračující konflikt je z velké části odpovědná Bidenova administrativa. ( <u>RT dnes zveřejnila článek</u>, který jasně uvádí, že dohody mezi Ruskem a Ukrajinou bylo dosaženo v březnu, ale dohoda byla úmyslně potlačena USA a Velkou Británií. Washington chtěl válku.)

Za třetí **ukazuje, že Putin je rozumný vůdce, jehož požadavky měly být dychtivě přijímány.** Bylo od Putina nerozumné žádat, aby "strany se zdržely rozmisťování svých ozbrojených sil a... vojenských aliancí... v oblastech, kde by takové rozmístění mohlo být druhou stranou vnímáno jako ohrožení své národní bezpečnosti"? Byl pro něj nerozumný požadavek, aby "strany odstranily veškerou existující infrastrukturu pro rozmístění jaderných zbraní mimo svá národní území"?

Kde přesně jsou "nepřiměřené požadavky", které prý Putin vznesl? Žádné nejsou. Putin nevznesl žádné požadavky, které by USA nevznesly, kdyby "bota byla na druhé noze".

Za čtvrté dokazuje, **že válka není bojem za osvobození Ukrajiny nebo demokracii. To je blbost. Je to válka, jejímž cílem je "oslabit" Rusko a nakonec odstranit Putina od moci. To jsou prvořadé cíle.** To znamená, že ukrajinští vojáci neumírají za svou zemi, umírají za elitářským snem rozšířit NATO, rozdrtit Rusko, obklíčit Čínu a prodloužit hegemonii USA o další století. Ukrajina je pouze bitevní pole, na kterém se vede boj o velmoc.

Jsem přesvědčen, že ani Washington, ani spojenci v NATO nemají ponětí o tom, jak těžce byly mezinárodní vztahy zdecimovány zradou v Minsku. Ve světě, kde lze právně závazné dohody snadno odhodit ve jménu politické výhodnosti, je jediný způsob, jak urovnat spory, pomocí hrubé síly. Přemýšlel o tom někdo v Německu, Francii nebo Washingtonu, než začal jednat? (Nejprve ale něco o Minsku.)


Cílem minské dohody bylo ukončit boje mezi ukrajinskou armádou a etnickými Rusy v oblasti Donbas na Ukrajině. Bylo odpovědností čtyř účastníků smlouvy – Německa, Francie, Ruska a Ukrajiny – zajistit, aby obě strany dodržovaly podmínky dohody. Ale v prosinci bývalá německá kancléřka Angela Merkelová v rozhovoru pro německý časopis řekla, že nikdy nebylo v úmyslu tuto dohodu realizovat, místo toho bylo v plánu využít čas k posílení Ukrajiny, aby se připravila na válku s Rusko. Je tedy zřejmé, že od samého počátku měly Spojené státy v úmyslu vyvolat válku s Ruskem.

(11:40 minut) .. V roce 2015 měly Německo a Francie hrát neutrální roli. Měly přimět Ukrajinu a Rusko k dodržování pravidel. Ale neudělali to a důvodem, proč to neudělali, je to, co Angela Merkelová odhalila ve svém rozhovoru 7. prosince. Merkelová řekla: "Dohoda z Minsku z roku 2014 byla pokusem dát Ukrajině čas. Dalo to také čas stát se silněiším, jak je dnes vidět. Ukrajina z let 2014 a 2015 není moderní Ukrajinou. V podstatě všichni tři partneři Minské dohody Ihali a zradili Rusko. Dokonce i Putin řekl: "Jednoho dne se Rusko bude muset dohodnout s Ukrajinou, ale Německo a Francie zradily Rusko a nyní pomáhají Ukrajině zbraněmi."... Je ostuda, že se západní političtí vůdci zapojují do jednání, která nedělají. hodlají ctít nebo prosazovat...(Ukrajinský prezident Petro Porošenko přiznal totéž co Merkelová a Hollande)...Teď i **Putin uznal, že bylo chybou** souhlasit s Minskými dohodami. Dokonce řekl, že problém Donbasu měl být v té době vyřešen silou zbraní. (2015) Rusko čekalo 8 let, než uznalo nezávislost Donbasu, a pak letos zahájilo útok v plném rozsahu. Ale **Putin měl tehdy dojem, že Minské dohody**– zaručené Německem a Francií a jednomyslně schválené Radou bezpečnosti OSN včetně Spojených států – by vyřešilo krizi a poskytlo by Donbasu autonomii a zároveň by zůstalo součástí **Ukrajiny**. Německo a Francie se měly postarat o to, aby byly minské dohody realizovány v letech 2015 až 2022. Kolektivní Západ vždy věděl, že jediným řešením je válka. Nikdy nechtěli mír, jen hráli ve jménu Minské dohody. Takže vidíte, je to diplomatická "výhra" pro západ.....

Francie a Německo usmířily Rusko dohodou z Minsku a daly falešné naděje na mírové urovnání. Ale ve skutečnosti tím získávali čas, aby Ukrajina vybudovala svou armádu. Nikdy neexistovalo diplomatické řešení; kolektivní západ – který zahrnuje **Spojené státy**, NATO, Evropskou unii a G-7 – oklamal Rusko, aby věřilo, že existuje diplomatické řešení konfliktu na Donbasu (ale) místo toho připravují Ukrajinu na plnohodnotnou válku proti Rusko. Tak či onak, tato válka se měla stát. Nikdy nebylo diplomatické řešení... Toto chtěla sdělit Angela Merkelová: "Studená válka nikdy neskončila". Byla německou kancléřkou, když v roce 2014 proběhl na Ukrajině převrat a byly podepsány Minské dohody. In Donetsk region, the SMM recorded 528 ceasefire violations, including 345 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 703 ceasefire violations in the region.

In Luhansk region, the Mission recorded 1,182 ceasefire violations, including 1,075 explosions. In the previous reporting period, it recorded 1,224 ceasefire violations in the region.

So, ceasefire violations had gone down in February, not up as Mike suggests. Then there is a detailed list oc ceasefire violations:

They are recorded by a camera. If the camera is on Ukraine government-controlled area and records a ceasefire violation e.g. resulting in an explosion, this explosion was in the government-controlled area, else the camera would not have recorded it. Thus, the grenade was shot from the separatist-controlled areas to the government-controlled areas. In the list you find for every violation marked where the camera was (government-controlled) or (non-government-controlled). It seems to me that there were ceasefire violations in this list to both directions and not any special increase of ceasefire violations recorded by cameras in non-government-controlled areas. This time I did not calculate how many violations were to each direction, but I did calculate this at the beginning of the war (you can calculate them if you want), and my conclusion was that there were more

ceasefire violations coming from non-government controlled areas to government controlled areas. So, this argument is simply false.

About NATO enlargening, the issue is that former Eastern Block countries all wanted to join NATO as soon as possible. NATO did not need to persuade them to join. They all were afraid of Russia. It is the right of an independent nation to try to secure its area against external threats. Russia was for some reason seen as a threat by these countries. # Year Two of the Ukraine War Is Going to Get Scary

Feb. 5, 2023

As we approach the first anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine — and the ferocious Ukrainian response backed by a U.S.-led Western coalition — the following question urgently needs answering: How is it that on Feb. 23, 2022, virtually no one in America was arguing that it was in our core national interest to enter into an indirect war with Russia to stop it from overrunning Ukraine, a country most Americans couldn't find on a map in 10 tries? And yet now, nearly a year later, polls show solid (though slightly shrinking) American majorities for backing Ukraine with arms and aid, even though this risks a direct conflict with Vladimir Putin's Russia.

That's a head-snapping shift in U.S. public opinion. Surely it's partly explicable by the fact that no U.S. combat forces are in Ukraine, so it feels as if all that we're risking, for now, is arms and treasure — while the full brunt of the war is borne by Ukrainians.

But there is another explanation, even if it's one that most Americans might not be able to articulate and many might only reluctantly agree with.

They know at some deep level that the world we live in today is tilted the way it is because of American power. That doesn't mean we have always used our power wisely, nor could we have succeeded without allies. But to the extent that we have used our power wisely and in

concert with our allies, we have built and protected a liberal world order since 1945, which has been hugely in our interest — economically and geopolitically.

This is an order in which autocratic great powers like Nazi Germany, imperial Japan or modern Russia and China are not free to simply devour their neighbors. And this is an order where more democracies than ever have been able to flourish, and where free markets and open trade have lifted more people out of poverty than at any time in the history of the world. It's not always perfect — but in a world where perfect is never on the menu, this order has produced almost 80 years without a Great Power war, the kind of war that can destabilize the whole world.







Ukraine began to reposition its forces along the Donbas as early as March 24, 2021, when Volodymyr Zelensky issued a decree for the recapture of the Crimea, and began to deploy his forces to the south of the country.

It is unlikely Zelensky would make such an aggressive decree without first receiving the approval of the United States and NATO.

In April 2021, the Ukrainian government publicly announced that they would seek nuclear weapons if they were not issued membership in NATO.
